Update on Morrison Park Plan Presented at Public Meeting



CHAP21 Holds Fall Clean Sweep Garbage Removed from neighborhood and 490 Ramps at Culver Road



Summary: An interurban street railroad trolley car is stalled by a flood near Culver Road and University Avenue. The flood was caused by a broken water main. A pickup truck splashes through the intersection ahead of the trolley.
People stand on the street corners. The building is probably the Stromberg-Carlson Telephone Company factory.
Notes: Rochester Herald, February 23, 1923. A water main break flooded the Culver Road/East Avenue/University Avenue area in February, 1923. The leak reportedly lowered the Cobbs Hill Reservoir by one-and-a-half feet.

His design will provide color in the park throughout the growing season and will also minimize future park maintenance. The feedback was overwhelmingly positive as attendees were excited to see the first significant changes to the park since its last dedication in 1975.

The next step in the process is to start fundraising. The Rochester Landscape Technician Program (501C3) has agreed to act as our fiduciary for the project. This will allow for tax deductible and matching gift donations to be made to the project. To kick off the fundraising, I would like to announce that we already have \$435 raised! (President Tom Hasman \$100, Board Member **Jim Hondorf** \$100+\$100 matching gift, Board Member George and Lorrie Lorson \$35, anonymous donor \$100.) 
