## City Noise Ordinance Amended...Tougher on Noise, Easier on the Ears...

Rochester City Council amended the existing Noise Ordinance, effective September 23rd, to include excessive noise emanating from any source, including but not limited to, voices or other sounds caused or emitted by humans which is audible be*yond* the property line of the premises from which it emanates between the hours of 10 pm and 8 am; audible at a distance of 50 feet beyond the property line of the premises from which it emanates between the hours of 8 am and 10 pm; audible at a distance of 50 feet from the source if emanating from a public street, public park, or other public place. Previously, this ordinance only referred to amplified sound. We must all be respectful and considerate of our immediate neighbors as well as all those in the neighborhood by being mindful of our noise levels. The change to this amendment further demonstrates the myth that, "ANYTHING GOES IN THE CITY," is not true! Violators will be ticketed!
