RPD...Responds to Neighborhood Concerns...On May 1<sup>st</sup>, The CHAP21 Board and a number of neighborhood residents met with Rochester Police Officer Bruce Philpott, Captain of the Highland Section and two of his Supervising Sergeants, regarding the inconsistent police response and

resolution of various quality of life issues in our neighborhood. This meeting was prompted due to a large number of late night parties where residents were subjected to: loud music, shouting, car horns, littering, and public urination as late/early as 5 a.m. Captain Philpott and his team were very supportive of our concerns and are committed to a "Zero Tolerance Policy" when responding to calls in our neighborhood. In the past, many violators of the city's Noise Ordiance in our neighborhood received multiple warnings before any punishment was given. Going forward, there will be no warnings, but tickets issued to those who disrupt the quality of life in our neighborhood.....
