

The book of Romans provides direction in beginning your journey:

For it is with your heart that you believe and are justified, and it is with your mouth that you profess your faith and are saved. As Scripture says. "Anyone who believes in him will never be put to shame." For there is no difference between Jew and Gentile—the same Lord is Lord of all and richly blesses all who call on him, for, "Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved." "Romans 10:8-13

Confession of Christ is what begins our journey. Confession is relinquishing your will to the will of God. As you begin your journey you will find that He will lead the way.
