HEDGES

BENSON

HEDGES

BENSON

HEDGES

I'm sorry. I'll be good. I'll be better. Finish your story.

BENSON

I don't even remember where I was.

HEDGES

BENSON

It drove Hugh away from me and into the arms of a beautiful hussy. Mildred Canby.

HEDGES

What a horrible name, too.

BENSON

HEDGES

You can say that again.

BENSON

HEDGES

BENSON

Me? Cry? Why should I cry?

HEDGES

Because you lost Hugh?

BENSON

HEDGES

BENSON

HEDGES

BENSON

I should hope not. A man who smokes is a very bad emotional risk.

HEDGES

Tim didn't smoke.

BENSON

But he drank. It's the same thing.

HEDGES

Did Hugh Gumbs drink?

BENSON

Among other things.

HEDGES

It must have been awful for you.

BENSON

It was heck. Sheer unadulterated heck.

HEDGES

That sounds funny.

BENSON

Believe me, it wasn't.

HEDGES

No, what you just said. About it being heck. I'm still used to people saying the other.

BENSON

It won't seem funny after awhile. You'll see.

HEDGES

Ruth?

BENSON

What?

HEDGES

I know it's none of my business, but I've seen that look in your eyes whenever Dr. Toynbee passes.

BENSON

The only look, as you put it, in my eyes when Dr. Toynbee passes is one of sheer and utter respect. Certainly not the look you're grossly alluding to. You're out of line, don't you think. Hedges?

HEDGES

You're not sweet on the good doctor?

BENSON

Dr. Toynbee is above that.

HEDGES

I know but are you?

Benson slaps her.

HEDGES (CONT'D)

Is any woman?

Benson slaps her again. They fall into each other and cry.

HEDGES (CONT'D)

BENSON

HEDGES

BENSON

I was never 230! Now shut up listen, will you?

HEDGES

I'm sorry Ruth.

BENSON

People are born without any faults, they simply fall into bad habits along life's way. Nobody's trying to change anybody at Ravenswood, Becky. It's the real them coming out, that's all.

HEDGES

The real them!

BENSON

Look, face it, you've got big thighs, that's the real you.

HEDGES

That's exactly what Tim Taylor didn't like about me. And now that I'm getting thinner they look even bigger. I know! I'm sniveling again! I don't know what to do about them, Ruth!

BENSON

Wear longer skirts! You can be so dense sometimes. I mean really, Hedges, I'm talking about a whole other thing and you start sniveling about diets. You can diet all you want and you're still going to end up with big thighs. That's not the point.

HEDGES

I'm sorry.

BENSON

And stop that horrible sniveling!

HEDGES

HEDGES (CONT'D)

pretending I'm improving when the real truth is, I'm getting worse!

BENSON

What are you doing?

HEDGES

Why shouldn't I? I'm no better than any one of them. I'm a disgrace to this uniform!

BENSON

Give me that!

HEDGES

Let me do it, Ruth!

BENSON

Have you lost your mind?

HEDGES

I wish I was dead!

Ruth and Hedges wrestle. Ruth starts to smoke.

HEDGES (CONT'D)

Ruth!

BENSON

Ohmygod! I wasn't thinking! I wasn't going to smoke one!
