Advocates for additional sanctions and working with European allies

Wants a full withdrawal, but unclear timetable

Would rejoin JCPOA

Would agree to partial sanctions relief in return for partial dismantling of nuclear program

Would not recognize Guaido;
Would support negotiations
between the Maduro
government and the
opposition

Does not support
USMCA or TPP

Supports
"strategic"
withdrawl

Emphasizes that the U.S. has a limited number of options dealing with China;
Opposes China's human rights record

Allow Congress to "reassert its Constitutional role in warmaking" Does not support the Green
New Deal; has a plan for clean
energy that does not allow for
U.S. development assistance
for high-carbon projects

Need for U.S. to provide security and economic assistance to Ukraine and foster its energy independence from Russia.

Wants a withdrawal from Afghanistan minus special forces counter-terrorist operations

Will only recommit to
JCPOA if Iran back tracks
on its current nuclear
trajectory

Wants to use JCPOA as blueprint for agreements with North Korea

Would not recognize Guaido; ambiguous on military intervention and wants stronger sanctions on Maduro government

Supports TPP as counter to China

Opposed to recent withdrawal, unclear otherwise

Advocates non-adversarial relationship with China;
Opposes China's human rights record and territorial aggression; Emphasizes cybersecurity

Unclear on AUMF repeal
