There is a second round of booster shots that are or will be available in your area. Please contact your local Health Department for more information. Most mask mandates have been lifted, but some businesses and Hospitals still require masks.

- 1. The job sector is still suffering from a lack of employees. Please be respectful to all employees and be patient if it takes longer to be served at a bar, restaurant or Lodge. Bus your own table at the Lodge and offer to help with dishes, events or Lodge maintenance. If you use the words "my Lodge" then please put action behind that statement.
- 2. Poker rooms: Senate Bill 564 (as reported without amendment): passed the Senate and is in the Regulatory reform Committee. The bill would amend the Bingo Act to do the following: -- Waive a \$50-per-day millionaire party license fee, beginning on the bill's effective date and before January 1, 2024. —

Allow a qualified organization to be issued up to six millionaire party licenses in calendar years 2021, 2022, and 2023. —

Allow, beginning on the bill's effective date until January 1, 2024, a millionaire party licensee to receive up to \$30,000, instead of \$20,000, in exchange for imitation money or chips on any day the licensee conducts a millionaire party. —

Increase the daily limit, from \$80,000 to \$120,000, divided by the number of days of gaming allowed under the license, if the millionaire party met certain conditions, beginning on the bill's effective date and before January 1, 2024.

We expect the number of events to increase and even if you are not planning to hold and event, your Lodge may qualify to become a venue for poker rooms. Contact your Territory managers or me for further details.

3. Please make sure you file your 2021-22 IRS 990-N postcard, 990 EZ or 990 after May1, 2022. We are exempt from tax on income related to our "purpose" as a Fraternal organization. Don't use "Other Income" to categorize Social Quarters or Lodge event income. That is a red flag for the IRS who could view it as "unrelated income" which is taxable.

4. The current bill to allow self-serve alcohol machines in qualified businesses is targeting micro-breweries and wine tasting rooms. You can research the cost and requirements for your Lodge to have one of the self-serve machines, but understand all penalties and fines are doubled for violations relating to these machines.
