As I mentioned in the April newsletter, we have been closing Chapters at an alarming rate. At that time, we had 58 Chapters. To date we have 50 Chapters. Three more Chapters are on hold and in jeopardy of closing. I could look at these figures and call it a disaster but using the "glass half full/glass half empty" adage, I am opting for "smaller but mightier". The Moose Legions did not close when we became a unified fraternity and we were once known as the Legion of the Heart of the Women of the Moose, so why not have a Chapter? Let me know your thoughts on this.

I am also dismayed that many Chapter members are still complaining about paying Lodge dues. Granted the Lodge rate of dues is substantially higher than the pre-merger Chapter dues. Again, using the "glass half full/glass half empty" scenario we have enjoyed the use of our Lodges at a huge discount for over 100 years so isn't it time to stop complaining. Yes, there was confusion about when Chapter members would pay Lodge dues, but it's time to get over that. Be grateful that in most cases you pay less than \$5.00 a month to enjoy the use of your Lodge. We have a Financial Assistance Committee that can hold functions to help Chapter members in need. Start using the resources available to you.

Youth Awareness

The Youth Awareness Program is revving up for the 2022-2023 year. If you are interested in having a Youth Awareness Congress at your Lodge please give me a call to schedule. We are start-

ing in the summer to give students more time to work on their Kid Talks. I or one of my Coordinators will be happy to hold a Congress at your

Lodge. Get with your district to hold a Congress in your area and start contacting students to have them attend for the Lodge to sponsor.

Students in the program do not have to have Moose affiliation. This is community service and your lodge will get a per capita credit. At this time there

is no limit on the amount of the credit. It also helps with the scoring of the Premier Lodge Award.

If your Lodge has more than 4 students you may want to contact a fellow Lodge about them sponsoring some of the students.

What are the responsibilities of sponsoring a high school student into the program? This is what I hear many lodges ask.

The sponsoring Lodge is responsible for the \$25 for each high school student to be enrolled in the program up to 4 students and \$10 each each after that, help if the student needs supplies and \$100 or more spending money if they do get selected to go to International Congress. Last year the students did go to the Space Center and Seaworld. The spending money is for souvenirs while they are there. Money can be raised by doing a 50/50 and/or holding a dinner to congratulate the student.

The State pays for the State scholarship money, the airfare & helps offset the cost of the room at the International Congress, The Lodge's check collected at the Mid Year Conference helps to pay this amount.

Moose International & the Sponsoring State handle the costs at the International Congress itself. This includes excursions, transportation, meals, etc. ----

The profit margin for a bar/restaurant operation is slim to begin with and inflation has had a huge impact on all FRU bottom lines. Please be respectful of the need to increase prices if that becomes necessary.
- 3. The Bridge news article "June 14, 2022, LANSING Pausing Michigan's gas tax and the sales tax on gasoline purchases could slice more than 50 cents a gallon off of wholesale fuel prices and is one of the few tools state officials have to ease the burden of high prices at the pump.
- 4. A majority of lawmakers have backed some type of tax freeze on gas purchases for months, arguing the state's \$6 billion budget surplus is enough to cover any hit to the state budget. But for months, lawmakers and Gov. Gretchen Whitmer have been unable to enact a gas tax holiday, even as prices skyrocket to \$5.22 per gallon as of Tuesday and states

from Maryland and Connecticut to Georgia, Florida and New York have suspended their taxes. The concern about rising gas prices and solutions to the problem started in March when gas prices rose to over \$4.00 a gallon. Most of us would welcome that now. There are solutions on the table so if this concerns you please contact your State Senator, Representative or the Governor's Office and ask them why this has stalled.

- 5. Poker rooms: No change to Senate Bill 564 (as reported without amendment): passed the Senate and is in the Regulatory reform Committee. The bill would amend the Bingo Act.
- 6. Congressman Jack Bergman of the UP has introduced the following legislation to improve school safety and access to mental healthcare resources. H.R. 7966, the STOP II: The Secure Every School and Protect our Nation's Children Act, 7. House Bill 5695 would amend the Michigan Liquor Control Code to allow an individual 16 years of age or older employed by a wholesaler to build a display of, mark the price of, rotate, and place brands that were represented or sold by the wholesaler for an off-premises retailer.

House Bill 5696 would amend the Code to reduce the age, from 18 to 16 years of age, of a person who need not be licensed as a salesperson to engage in certain activities, including building displays of brands or marking prices.

House Bill 5726 would amend the Youth Employment Standards Act to allow a work permit to be issued for a minor 16 years of age or older for employment with an establishment where alcoholic beverages are distributed.

The bills would have no fiscal impact on State or local government. All bills passed the house and Senate 6-16-2022.



- 1. Plus 1 in membership over May 1 2021 will save your lodge \$1 per member in per capita
- 80% Retention of membership from May 1 2021 will save your lodge \$1 per member.
- Selling \$100 tickets. The lodge will save 10 cents per ticket up to 8 tickets a year, so .80 per member in savings to the lodge.
- 4. International Convention. The President and Administrator must register and attend the international convention and will receive .15 per person for up to 2 people attending. If necessary, one of these attendees can be represented by a lodge member that has been voted on, registered and attended the convention. So the lodge would save up to .30 per member.
- 5. MMA Convention/Conference attendance. The President and Administrator must register and attend the convention/conference and will receive .15 per person for up to 2 people attending twice a year. If necessary, one of these attendees can be represented by a lodge member that must register and attended the convention/conference. \$.15 each 2 times a year. So the lodge could save up to .60 per member
- 6. District meetings The President and Administrator would get .10 per attendee for up to 2 members per meeting, 10 meetings a year and submit a lodge report. If necessary, one of these attendees can be represented by a lodge member. The Lodge could save up to \$2 per member by attending all meetings and turning in a lodge report. The president OR administrator must attend or no points.
- On time reporting for Moose of the Year, Valued Vet, and 6 lodge Orientations. Lodge could save up to .30 per member. Late reports will not be graded.
- Heart of the Community grade. Each report graded Good or better will earn 1 point. Up to 4 points a
 year could save the lodge up to .20 per member. Remember, late reports are not graded.
- Youth Awareness Students. If your lodge sponsors students to the Youth Awareness training it would receive .25 per student up to 4 students. Could save the lodge up to \$1 per member
