ALL STUDENTS SHOULD HAVE:

- Pens

NOTE ON SNACKS:

Learning requires fuel and nourishment. All students will want snacks in their dorms, but some snacks are much better than others. *Non-sugary snacks and drinks are strongly recommended! Please do not provide soda and candy in large quantities.*

Instead we recommend nuts, seeds, trail mixes, granola bars, popcorn and dried fruit, whole grain crackers or chips, cereals, kale chips, soups, and water.

COMPUTER REQUIREMENTS & RECOMMENDATIONS

A laptop which meets the Operating System and Software requirements listed below is highly recommended. Net books¹, Chrome Books² and other ultra-portable devices may have certain limitations which can hinder academic productivity. Desktop are acceptable as long as they have Wi-Fi capability; however, laptops are much more useful as a desktop cannot be taken with a student's to study hall.

Students do **NOT** need to purchase Microsoft Office. All student have access to Office 365 and can download the desktop version.

Windows Computer Recommendations

- A laptop with a 13.1" or larger screen.
- Windows Pro or higher version of Windows 10 (Windows Home, Basic or RT editions are limited and are not recommended.)
- Internet Browser – Latest version of Chrome, Internet Explorer, or Mozilla Firefox.
- Anti-Virus Software⁵ – Recommended free anti-virus software - Avast Free Antivirus, or AVG AntiVirus Free⁴.

Mac Computer Recommendations

- Mac – OSX 10.8 or higher.
- Internet Browser – Latest version of Chrome, Safari, or Mozilla Firefox.
- Anti-Virus Software⁵ – Avast Free Antivirus for Mac or ClamXav⁴.

Linux Computer Recommendations³

- Ubuntu 18.04 or higher of any flavor or Linux Mint 18.3 or higher are recommended.
- Internet Browser – Latest version of Chrome or Firefox.
- Anti-Virus Software⁵ - Comodo Antivirus for Linux, or ClamAV Antivirus for Ubuntu⁴.

As per the Technology Policy found in the Student Handbook, the following genera of software are strictly forbidden. Offending software should be removed from your computer before bringing it on campus. P2P software Bittorent, eMule, Gnutella, uTorrent, and all their ilk are strictly forbidden.

1. Netbooks generally only offer Windows Basic.
2. Chrome books are limited to using Office 365 and students will need to print from one of the school's desktop computer.
3. Linux computers are limited to Office 365 and printing may be limited.
4. All students are required to maintain and update their anti-virus software. Assistance is available in the Tech office.
5. Trend Micro is not compatible with the school's firewall. Bringing a system with this anti-virus package on will prevent them from being able to use the school's network.
