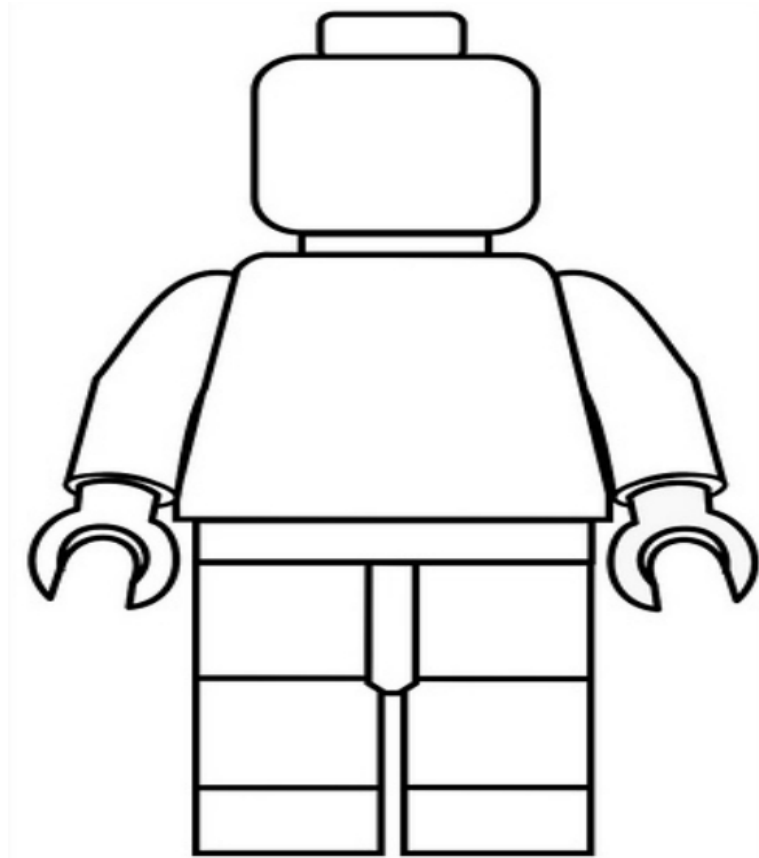


Language Arts
