Singapore Math Test Results Summary

FCCS students were given two Singapore math tests as pretests in the Fall and then the same tests again in the Spring, as one tool to assess the student's progress in learning the math objectives for the year. Test A contains less difficult material than does Test B. Each class was administered the Singapore tests one grade level below their actual grade level. The exception to that rule is that first graders took the Singapore level 1 test.

Each graph shows the individual student scores as dots, the box shows you the middle 50% of the students with the line in the box representing the median score. The class range is identified by the whiskers of the graph. On several graphs you will see scores represented by dots outside the whisker marks indicating that these scores are outliers. Since the tests took several days to complete it is possible that some of those scores are due to children not completing a given test.

Please note that the 5<sup>th</sup> grade pretest data is not available for test 4A, so it is not reported. Also note that post-test data is not available for half of the first grade students for 1B and for half of the second grade students for 1B, so the sample size is smaller on those graphs.
