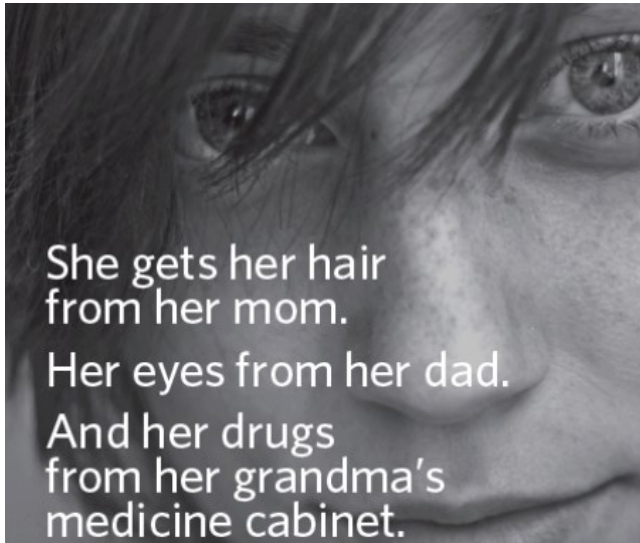


Prescription Drugs can KILL!

them from friends and family.**

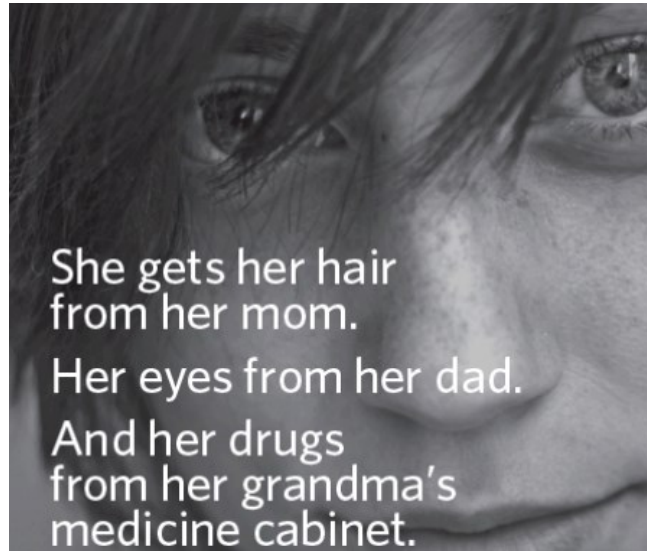

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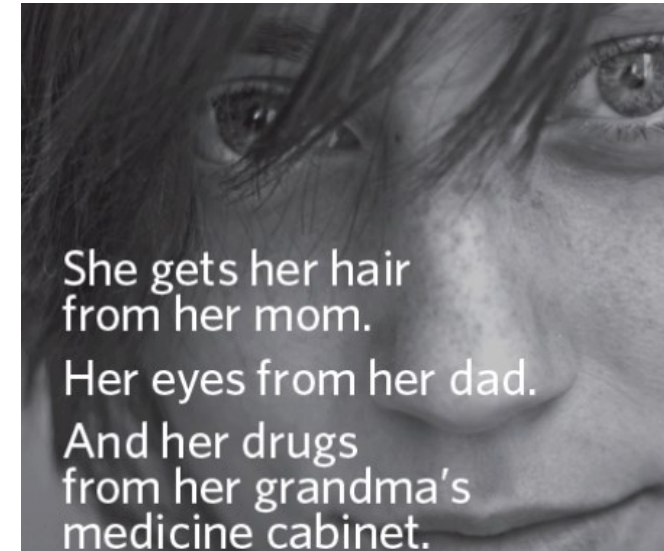
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Prevent Overdose

- Only take medication that are prescribed to you.
- Never share prescribed your medication.
- Store your medicine securely.
- Never mix opioid pain medication with alcohol.
- Avoid mixing pain medication with sedating drugs such as sleeping pills or benzodiazepines.
- Always tell your Doctor if another Doctor has prescribed you other medications.
- If your pain gets worse, DO NOT take more pain medication than you were prescribed: call your doctor.
- Dispose of unused medication safely.
- **All unused or expired medication can be taken to Taos Police Department on Civic Plaza drive for proper disposal. Drop offs are anonymous.**

Signs of Narcotic Overdose

- ◆ **Tiny Pupil. Nausea, Sweating, Confusion, Vomiting, Loss of consciousness**
