Health Care for All-Oregon Changes Name to “TrumpCare Oregon”!

April 1, 2016 - After a solid string of victories in the Republican Primaries and Caucuses across the country, Presidential candidate Donald Trump abruptly ended his campaign yesterday, announcing “I can’t believe these morons actually voted for me! I entered this race as a lark, and did everything I could to insult and alienate as many people as I possibly could, but apparently that only strengthened my support among the core of the Republican Party.”
