Insurance companies are running the show; they "dictate which doctor can be seen, how much doctors are reimbursed, how much time doctors meet with patients and which medications will be insured," as Morris sums it up.

How can we change this? A publicly supported system which includes all residents of Oregon and the United States, generally known as single payer, is the obvious answer. In short, Medicare for all.
