

## NCAA Division I Schools

*The NCAA divides their ski programs into three conferences or regions; Eastern, Central and Rocky Mountain. These teams are fully funded by the college or university and athletes are often recruited. To be a member of the varsity team at NCAA Division I schools, alpine prospective athletes are expected to have 25-45 FIS points in one event and 30-55 in the other. There are, however, several schools on this list with less competitive ski teams where the point profile of student-athletes is between 60 and 80.*
