High Adventure/Trip Leader

Position Title: High Adventure/Trip Leader

Purpose: The High Adventure/Trip Leader is responsible for supporting the overall summer program by organizing and leading High Adventure and program Trips. The High Adventure/Trip Leader works alongside permanent staff to assure safe off-site trips and high adventure programs.

Accountability: The direct line of supervision for the High Adventure/Trip Leader is to the Assistant Director, and ultimately, the Executive Director.

Minimum Qualifications:

- Must be willing to engage in ministry and mission of the particular setting, recognizing our connection as a Presbyterian Church (USA) Camp and Conference Center
- Be able to work with others cooperatively and creatively
- Be flexible and willing to support the overall life and ministry that occurs at camp
- Be able to carry out the directions of your supervisors
- Will ordinarily be at least a Senior in college
- Prior experience in a camp and conference ministry setting

Responsibilities of High Adventure/Trip Leader Position include, but are not limited to, the following:

1. High Adventure and Trip Program planning and preparation in coordination with permanent staff.
2. Management and oversight of high adventure summer program operations as assigned.
3. Provide for risk-management during summer programs and both on- and off-site high adventure programs.
4. Participate fully in the daily life and activities of the camp community.
5. Provide leadership and creativity to enhance the camping program.
6. Love unconditionally all participants by demonstrating and sharing your Christian faith simply and honestly in word and deed.
7. Complete assigned duties as directed by your immediate supervisor and/or the Executive Director.
8. Abide by the personnel policies of the Outdoor Ministries Division of Trinity Presbytery, the Fellowship Camp and Conference Center and the Presbytery.
9. Abide by the community standards for camp.
10. Work, laugh, and have fun.
11. Other duties and responsibilities as assigned.
