**Preserve and Protect: Archives Security** Many archives and special collections libraries are experiencing operational challenges. As a result, physical security of collections in the face of theft or vandalism of collections can be a growing concern. Materials stolen are often rare, valuable and irreplaceable. Security is a fundamental, integral component of archival management that is in part tied to appraisal, arrangement and description, reference and preservation. Protection of records includes: deterrents to theft; identification of missing items; environmental control; protection from fire, flood and other disasters; safe exhibition and loan procedures; and insurance for valuable items. The Canadian Council of Archives webinar on Archival Security will provide an introduction to risk assessment, policies and procedures to minimize risks and prevent loss of records, security training for staff, security systems and equipment and crisis management.

**The Economic Halo Effect of Historic Sacred Places: Vulnerability, Public Value, and New Approaches** This webinar will focus on the importance of historic sacred places as an economic value in communities. The presenter will be Tuomi Forrest of Partners for Sacred Places. Tuomi has offered technical advice and consultation to thousands of congregations of all faiths on the care and active community use of their historic religious buildings. He has contributed to publications such as *Sacred Places at Risk* (1998), *Open the Doors: A Guide to Serving Families in Sacred Places* (2001), and *Your Sacred Place is a Community Asset: A Tool Kit to Attract New Resources and Partners* (2002), and he has also spoken at many conferences and workshops around the country. He is the developer and co-author of the research paper, *If you do not count it; it does not count: a pilot study valuing urban congregations*. He is a lead designer and trainer for Partners' New Dollars/New Partners program and currently oversees all of Partners' programming and research efforts. Previously, Tuomi worked at the Preservation Alliance for Greater Philadelphia and as an architectural photographer. He received an M.A. in American Studies from the University of Virginia and a B.A. in Political Science from Haverford College.
