**Old Business:**

- Closed the Youth Club on Mondays and Tuesdays and there hasn't been a problem.
- Mia Connor, a student, will paint a wolf on the dugouts at Perry Field.
- Summer hires have started to help with park lawn maintenance and garbage. We have 2 people at 40 hours/week each.

**Supervisor's Report:**

- The technical education teacher, Matt Abel, measured for a display case for Knudson Hall to hold some of the historical pieces. His students developed a plan and plans are to carry this out in the fall.
- Cookouts at North Water Bakery have begun on Saturdays from 9-1 with all proceeds going to the Park and Recreation Department.
- A Dance Camp for ages 5-7 took place on Saturday June 2<sup>nd</sup> with 10 participants.
- June 9<sup>th</sup> we will have an Acting Class for grades 1-3 and Hip Hop Workshop for grades 4-6 with Miss Mary from the Music and Arts School of Door County.
- The Park Dept. has been working on the Frisbee Golf Course: weeding, trimming, and general maintenance of areas in need of repair. The display case has been fixed up and a map of the course is in the works. Some of the steps need to be replaced along the course and some gently used railroad ties have been donated in order to do this.
- We've wrapped up the Playground Safety Check at the parks and are working on replacing, repairing, and rearranging equipment where needed. This will be ongoing over the summer and fall. Critical areas have been identified and are taking priority.
- The Blood Mobile came on May 15<sup>th</sup> and 40 units of blood were collected. Thirty-three appointments were scheduled, 49 showed, and 10 were deferred. The goal was 35 units. The potential number of patients impacted is 120. We are looking at conducting some joint efforts with local businesses willing to offer incentives and contact has been made with the schools regarding educational programming for next year.
