## Best Practices in Eating Disorder Diagnosis and Management

## An Introductory Course

This 24 hour CME course is designed to provide comprehensive introductory training for both physical and mental health professionals interested in treating individuals with anorexia nervosa (AN), bulimia nervosa (BN), binge eating disorder (BED), and avoidant-restrictive food intake disorder (ARFID). The course includes a detailed course pack with session by session outlines, links to current clinical research, book chapters and journal articles supporting each session, pre and post-tests, and course evaluation.

Topics covered include the following:

- Psychological and behavioral characteristics of each eating disorder
- Medical complications of each disorder
- Epidemiology and Etiology
- Biopsychosocial Risk Factors for the development of eating disorders
- Treatment Alternatives
- Conducting the initial assessment
- Cognitive Behavioral Treatment
- Treatment of comorbid ED patients with borderline personality disorder
- Patient termination, relapse prevention
- Community resources, national resources


