Why do we make a yearly \$50 payment for Registration to the Navy League of Canada Branch?

The importance of the \$50 Registration fee is to help offset payment for your son/daughter(s) insurance for the cadet year, along with funds for corps activities.

For clarity, the registration fee helps covers the annual Navy League Insurance fee of approx. \$25.00 which we have to pay for every cadet. The additional \$25.00 is noted as a donation to NLC Calgary Branch for which you will receive a tax receipt.

The minimum average cost per cadet in RCSCC UNDAUNTED is \$1000 per year.

This registration also permits you to vote at our Annual General Meeting. Upon registration you will be issued a card which you will have to provide when voting at the AGM, as this is proof of your registration.

Many of our programs are enhanced by very generous donations from friends and families such as yourselves and we are grateful to have you as a supporter of our cadet Corps.

If for any Reason this amount is not financially feasible, please speak with the president of the branch directly and as soon as possible to chat about other possible payment options.

Why do we ask that you volunteer to help raise money? Volunteer Point System

The cadet program is operating via fundraising efforts, gaming and casino funding and generous donations.

Facts:

1. Bingo funding is our primary annual funding source.
2. Casino funding is only available once per 18 month cycle.
3. General fundraising efforts are a small portion of the funding.
4. Donations are currently not a consistent funding resource.
5. Extra activities are funded in Thirds: Corps Budget (1/3), Branch Budget (1/3), and family (1/3).
6. The corps Budget and Branch Budget is funded by all fundraising resources.

Needs:

1. To stay operational we need to continue raising funds via all avenues
2. To continue operating with a well-rounded program that we are used to, we need strong funding resources.
3. To help fund upcoming major trips for Captain Jackson cadets and Undaunted Cadets.
4. To continue, we need you to volunteer your time.

How many V volunteer Points are required for each cadet?

This will be our second year of running the **V P** system which was a success last year but we could still do better.

The Calgary Branch requires you to earn 50 **V P**'s per cadet with a maximum family requirement of 100 **V P**'s. Each volunteer opportunity will have an assigned point value, and will be tracked.

The **V P**'s will be used to earn the branch funding portion of that event thus minimizing the potential cost to the family for that event.

Planned events include but not limited to: Out of province trips, Range Comp., Camps, ski/snow shoeing trips, Orca trips etc.

Rule of Thumb: 1 planned volunteer hour = 1 **V P** See attached activities/positions for volunteers to fulfill.
