The Ezekiel Chronicles

Ezekiel 37: 1-14



The God Of The Impossible

Why “The Ezekiel Chronicles”? I have always been fascinated by the valley of dry bones in Ezekiel 37. I love the imagery of God bringing dead bones back to life and creating a mighty army. After all, isn’t this essentially what He does with us? Hasn’t He breathed life into your dry bones and brought you to life? Not just at your salvation, but doesn’t He continue to breathe into you every day afterwards?

My favorite pastor, the late Adrian Rogers, had this to say about Ezekiel 37:

In this passage the Spirit of God carried Ezekiel to a strange place, the site of a tremendous battle, a valley where countless people had been slain long before. In this valley Ezekiel saw dry bones strewn everywhere. Bones picked clean by the birds and washed by the rain and bleached by the sun. Bones baked and brittle. And then God said to Ezekiel, “Son of man, can these bones live?” I’m certain that Ezekiel was tempted to say, “No, that’s impossible.” But he was smart. He said, “God, You know.” And of course the God of the impossible was about to show Ezekiel that indeed those bones could live . . . We see how God brings life from death. What the God of the impossible has done for Israel He can do for any situation. He can bring life out of death. He can revive your lost friend or neighbor or family member, that person who is dead in trespasses and sin.

God came to Ezekiel and gave him a commission. He called Ezekiel to believe God is the God of the impossible. And, friend, that commission is for each of us. Do you believe that God can give life to your loved ones? Then look upon your unsaved friends and neighbors with divine expectancy. Speak with divine urgency, the same urgency with which Ezekiel brought the Word of God, this living and powerful book that presents the living Lord Jesus Christ . . . Look at what Ezekiel saw: “So I prophesied as He commanded me, and breath came into them, and they lived, and stood upon their feet, an exceedingly great army.” . . . Friend, if we will proclaim the Word and seek in prayer and believe God, we will discover that God is the God of the impossible. And that dry bones can live.

What about you? Do you believe that God can raise a mighty army in our church? Are you willing to be a witness to the “impossible” things that God wants to do? I know I am! I would love for you to join me.
