County Executive Gives Green Light to SPI and Children's Museum

At an April 4th press conference announcing the signing of Sustainable Playland's (SPI) 10-year asset management agreement to run Westchester County's Playland Park, representatives from the Westchester Children's Museum (WCM) expressed their appreciation for the ongoing support from

both the Westchester County Board of Legislators and Sustainable Playland. Additionally, County Executive Rob Astorino verbalized his support for the presence of a children's museum in the North Bathhouse as a year-round attraction at Playland.

Tribute to Jim Gurfein

We were deeply saddened by the loss of board member Jim Gurfein in March. Jim Gurfein was originally introduced to us in 2005 by the graphic designer who created our logo. At that time, we were a much smaller, yet equally determined, board with a growing database of donors and volunteers, no online presence at all, and a capital campaign to run without a true donor management system. Jim resolved these issues for us and more. He became very interested in our mission and soon "adopted" the WCM as one of his causes. With the support of Jim, and his company MediaSpa, the museum's online presence soon became much bigger than our physical reality.



Jim had been ill for a long time but chose not to share it outside of his immediate family and close friends. He attended as many board meetings as he could in the last three years, and when we did see him, he always showed us the same vigor and tenacity that we had come to expect.

Jim will be fondly remembered for asking the tough questions, but being willing to be convinced one way or another if you had a good answer. Sometimes he already knew the answer but just wanted to see if you knew it too.

Jim will be sorely missed by this organization. Our thoughts and sincerest condolences go out to his family.
