



Looking for dental care in your community?

In many parts of Washington, it is hard to find a dentist that takes Medicaid, or offers affordable care for those without dental insurance. Here are several programs that may be able to connect you and your family with care:

[Access to Baby and Child Dentistry \(ABCD\)](#) is a public-private partnership managed by the Washington Dental Service Foundation, connecting low income children age birth to 5 with dental providers. Even if you are looking for care for adults and children over the age of 5, many of the ABCD coordinators are familiar with dental clinics that serve low income and Medicaid-insured families.

[Washington State Health Care Authority](#) is the state agency that oversees Medicaid and has a list of providers you can search in your area. This list includes providers that have at one time accepted Medicaid. They may not be taking new patients, and they may have restrictions on age and availability.
