

Study: Building evidence for updating Canada's disease classification system in primary care

Feedback from family physicians is critical for exploring potential options to replace the ICD-9 coding system used in primary care settings.

We are assessing the acceptability and use of two new systems:

- **International Classification of Disease version 11 (ICD-11)** developed by the World Health Organization (WHO)
- **International Classification of Primary Care Version 3 (ICPC-3)** developed by the World Organization of Family Doctors (WONCA)

- 1** Watch a **short educational video** introducing you to ICD-11 and ICPC-3.
- 2** **Complete an online coding exercise** where you will be presented with **5 patient vignettes and asked to select codes using the ICD-9, ICD-11 and ICPC-3 systems.**
- 3** **Answer questions** about your experience with the new coding systems.

Your participation will take approximately **60 minutes**. You will receive a **\$200 gift card** for your time.

The coding exercise & survey will be open from **March to June 2023**. The full project runs from April 2022-March 2025.

An optional focus group will be held in Fall 2023.
