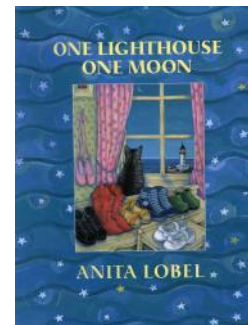

Anita Lobel



Anita Lobel is an award winning children's book author and illustrator. Her books have appeared on The New York Times Best Illustrated List. She has received a Caldecott Honor Medal for her illustrations in "On Market Street," and her childhood memoir, "No Pretty Pictures," was a finalist for a National Book Award. Lobel was born into a Jewish family in Krakow, Poland in 1934. She and her brother avoided capture by the Nazis until 1944. They were rescued in 1945 by the Swedish Red Cross after spending time in a series of concentration camps. Two years later they were reunited with their parents in Stockholm. Five years after their reunion, the family moved to New York. It was there she attended Pratt Institute, married and had a family, and started her career. She continues to live happily in her favorite city in the world.

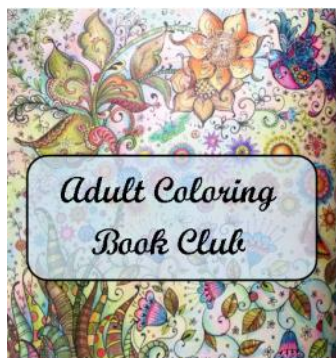
May 17, 12:30-2:30

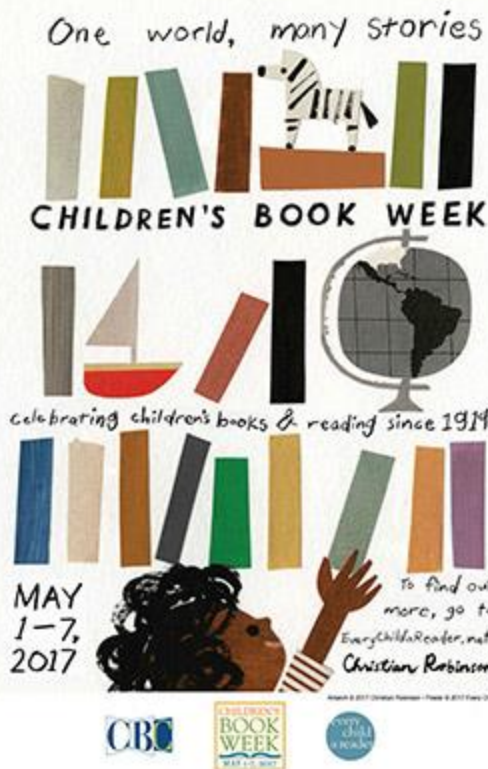
