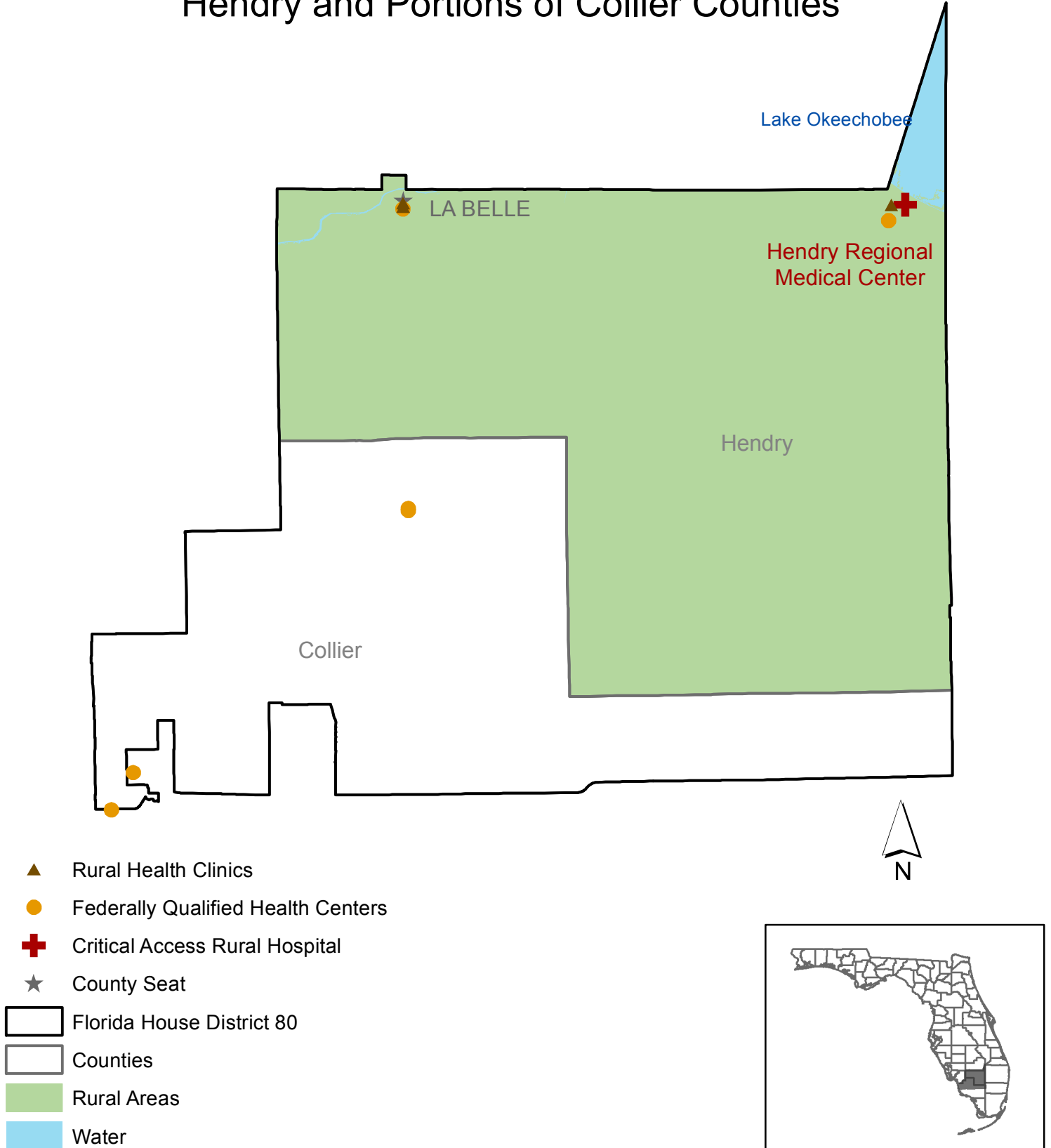


# Florida House District 80

## FLORIDA HOUSE DISTRICT 80

### FLORIDA'S RURAL HEALTH STATUS, HEALTH ACCESS, & QUALITY:

- Florida's age adjusted death rate for residents of rural counties exceeded those of urban residents for 20 of the 25 leading causes of death for 2008 through 2010;
- Florida had the fifth highest percentage of uninsured, non-elderly persons (20.6%) in the U.S. in 2012; the percentage of uninsured in Florida's rural counties was 34.4% in 2011.
- The percentage of Florida's uninsured children decreased to 10.9% but was the sixth highest in the nation in 2012;
- The proportion of eligible children in rural counties enrolled in Florida's KidCare Program was only two-thirds of the rate for urban counties.
- Florida improved on 11 of 25 measures of health care quality and declined on 9 measures in the 2012 National Healthcare Quality Report and was rated low average compared to other states;
- Florida ranked 47th among states and the District of Columbia on measures of child health system performance compiled by the Commonwealth Fund in 2011.
