1990s had *Ragtime, Jekyll and Hyde* and *I Love You, You're Perfect, Now Change*. From the year 2000 to now, Broadway has continued to produce outstanding musicals, with great songs from *Avenue Q* and *Wicked*.

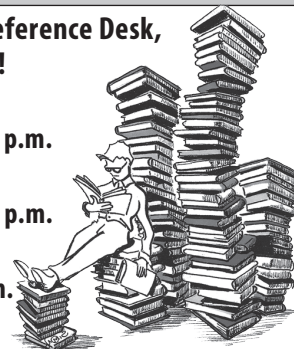

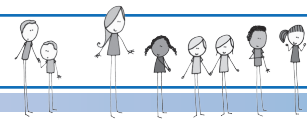

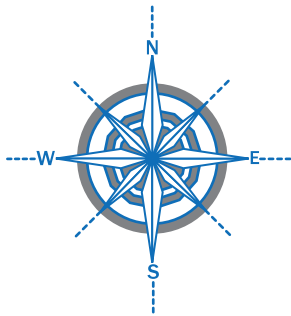
