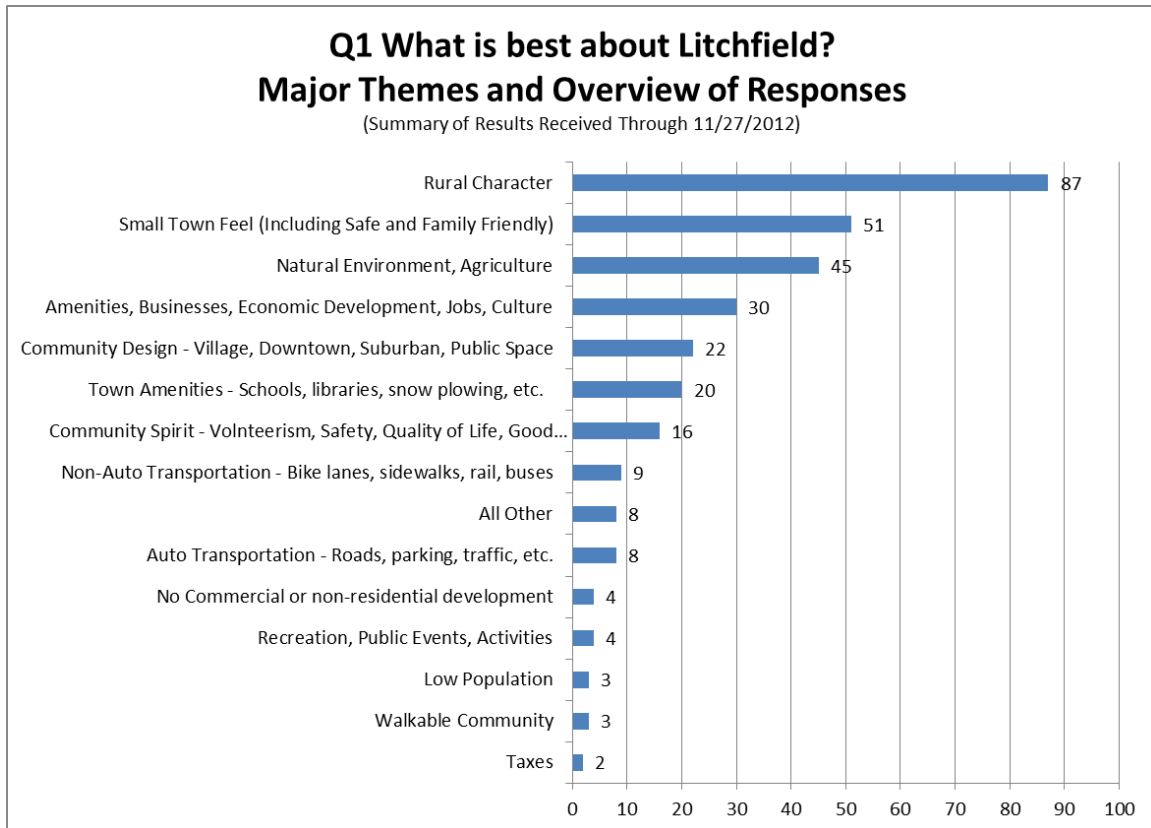
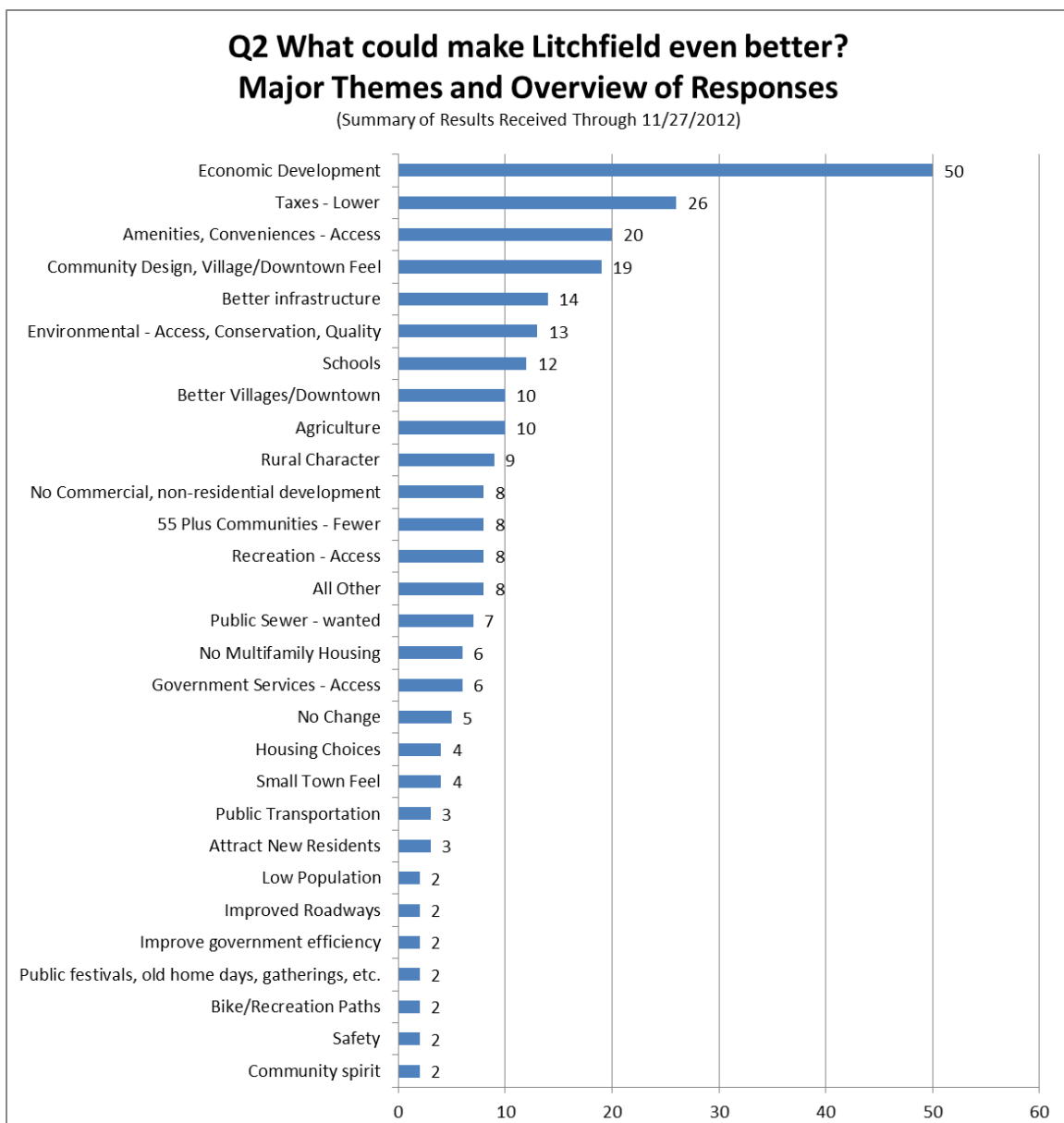


Q1: What is best about Litchfield?

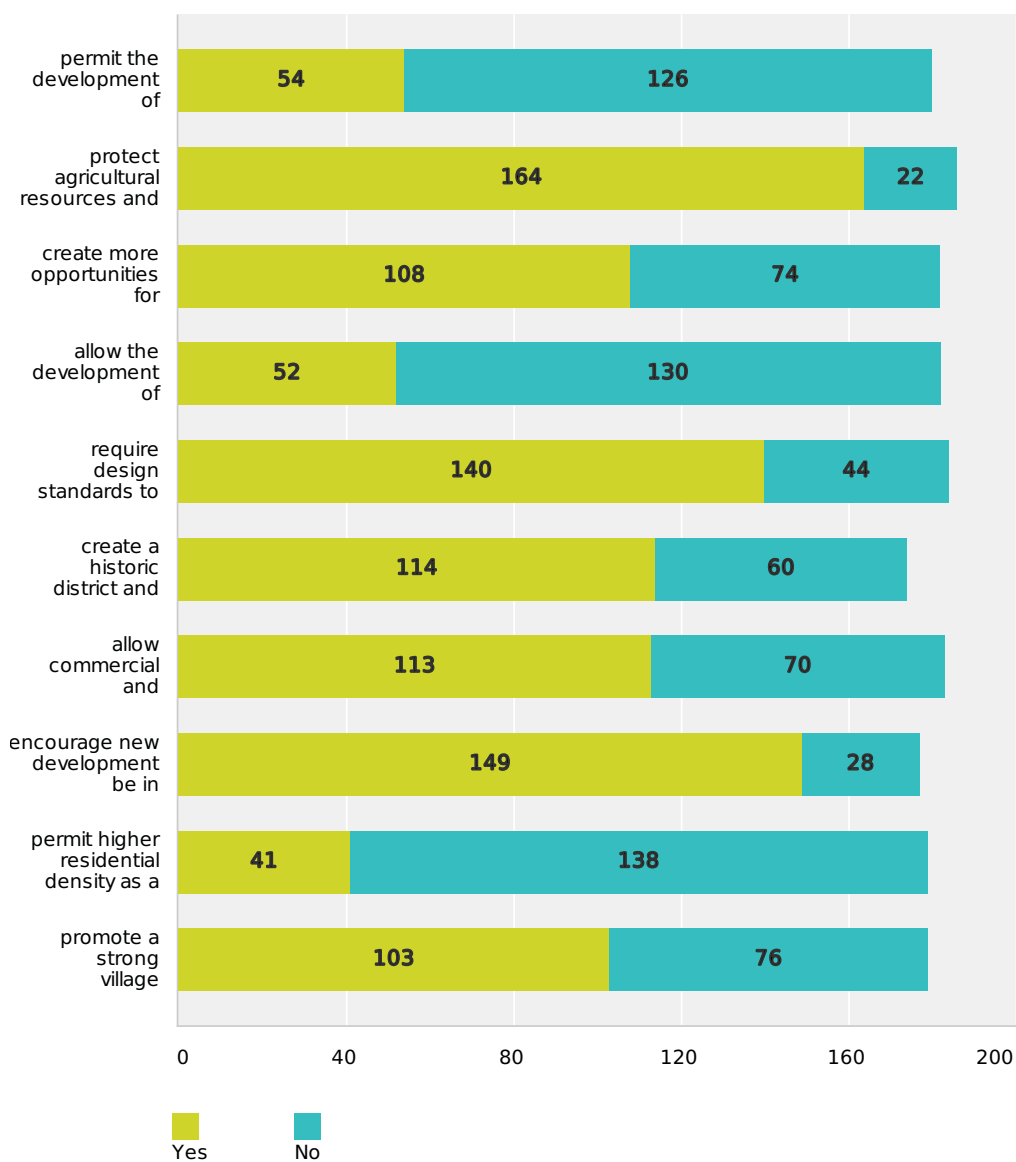

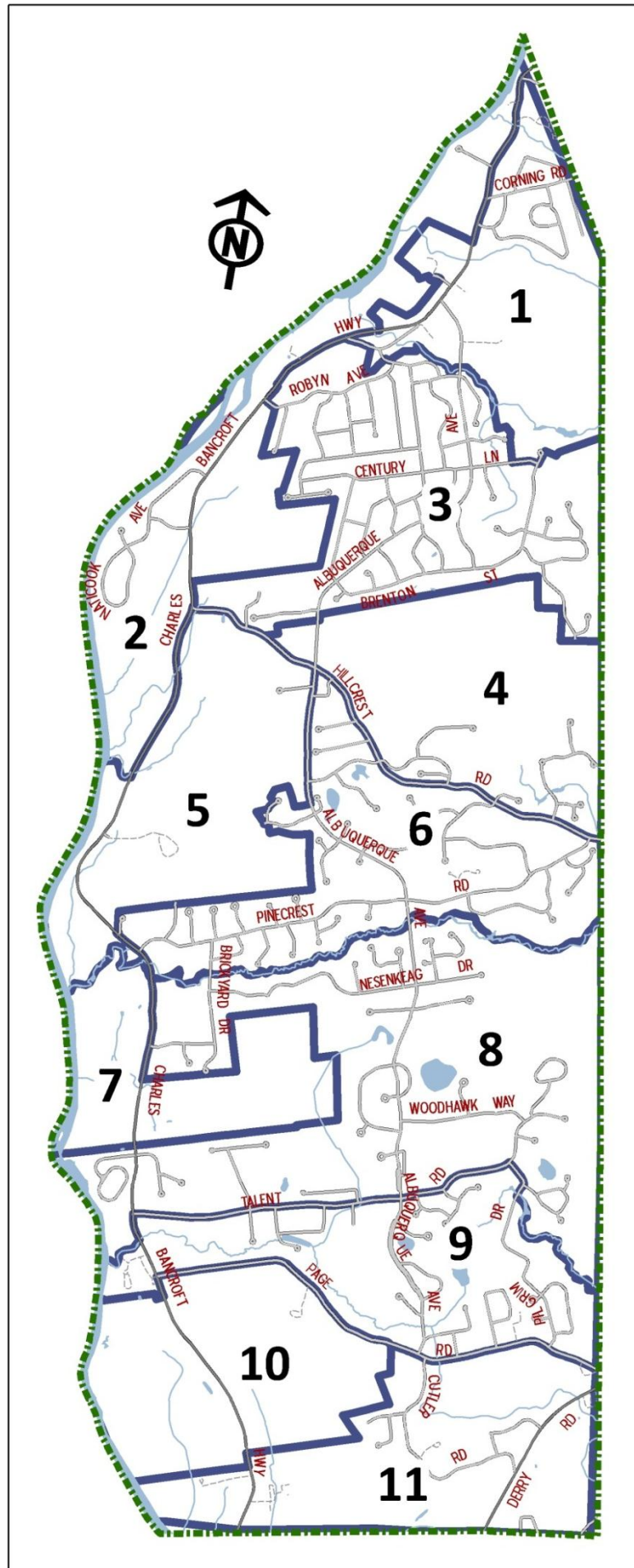

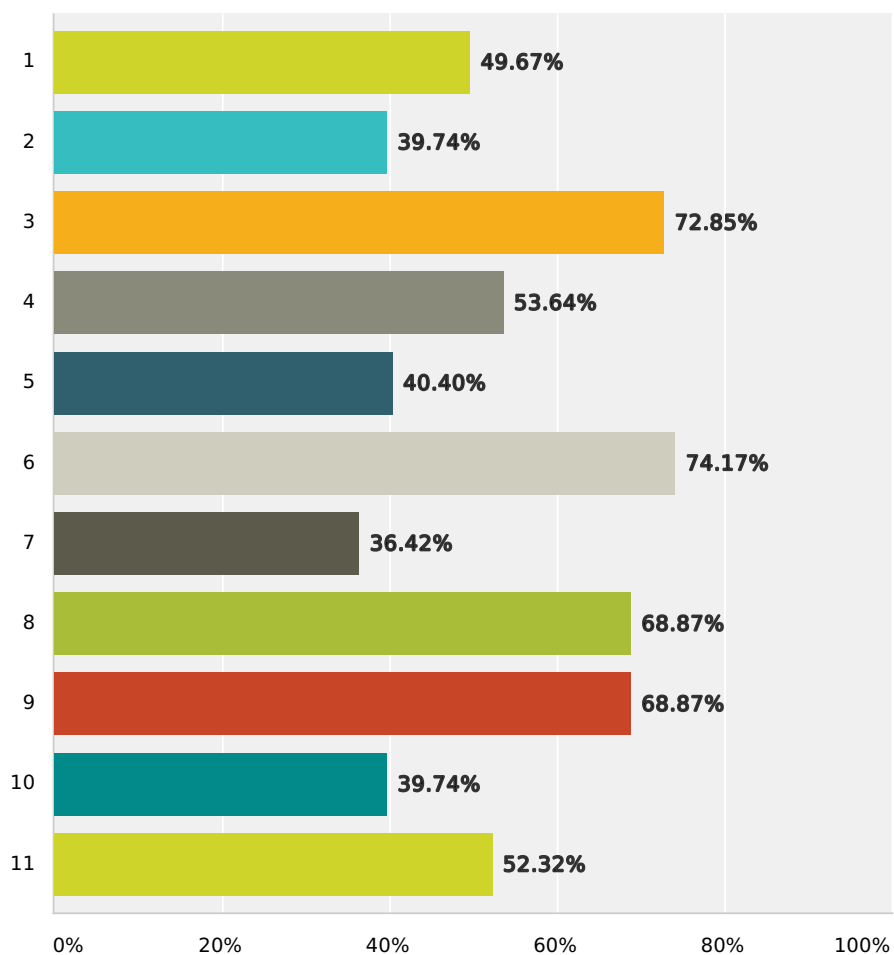

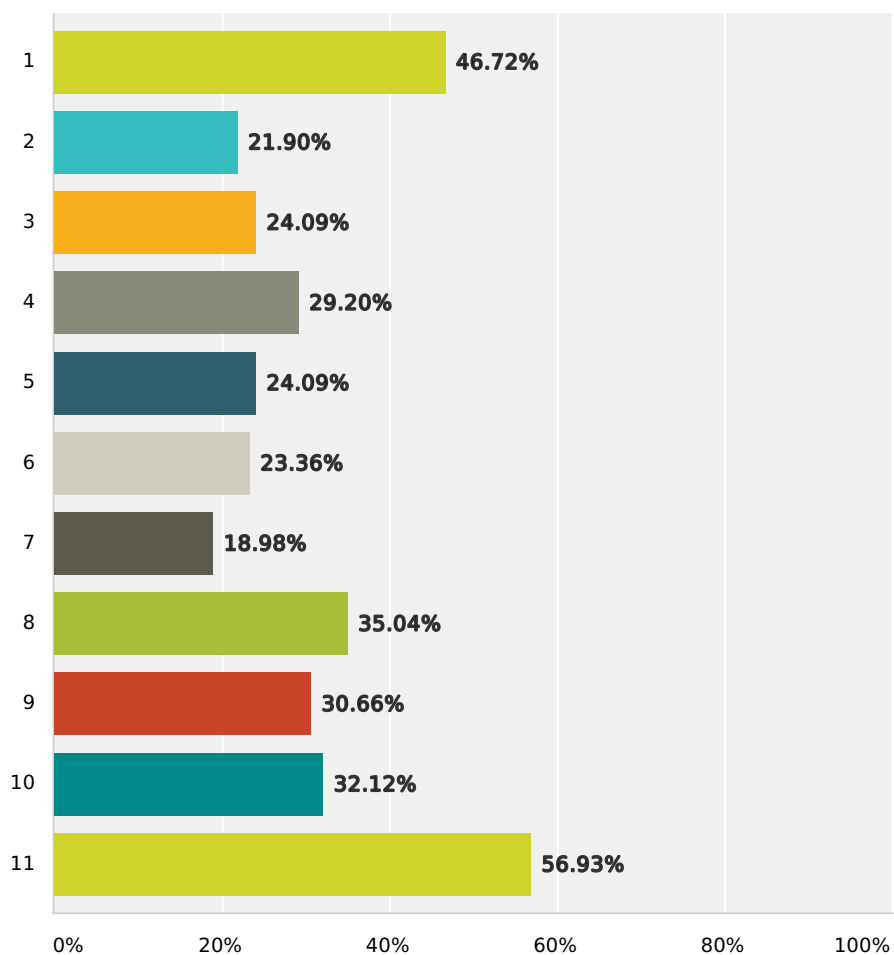

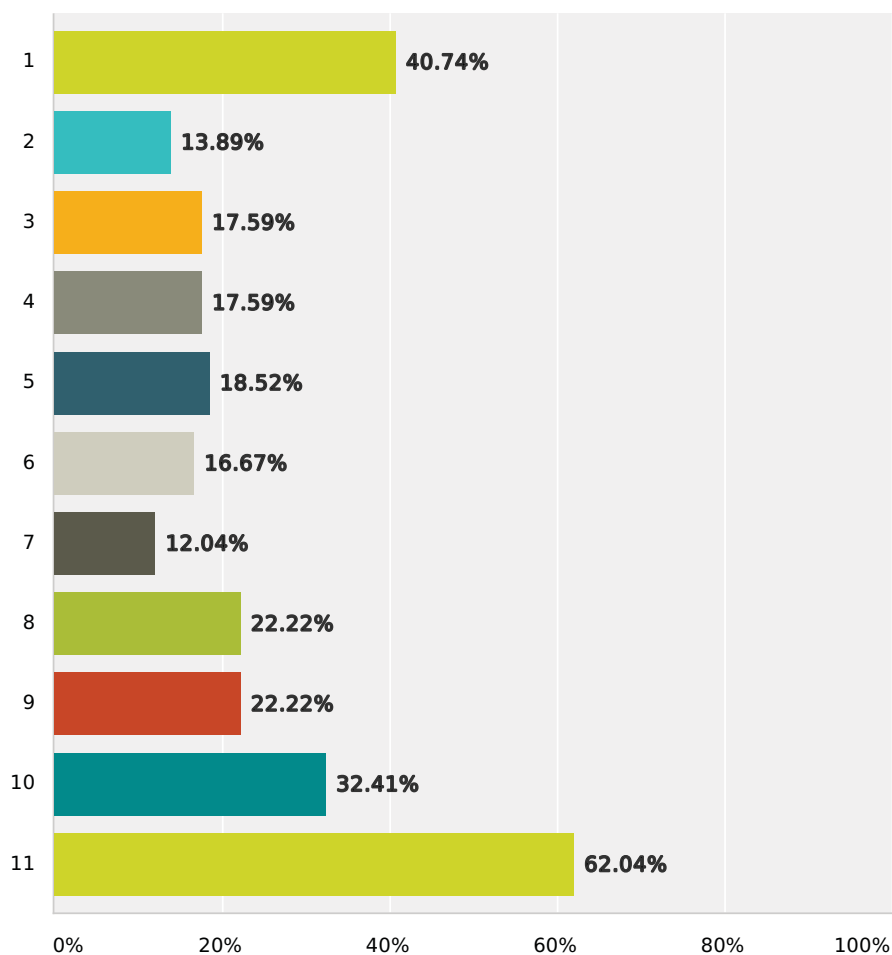

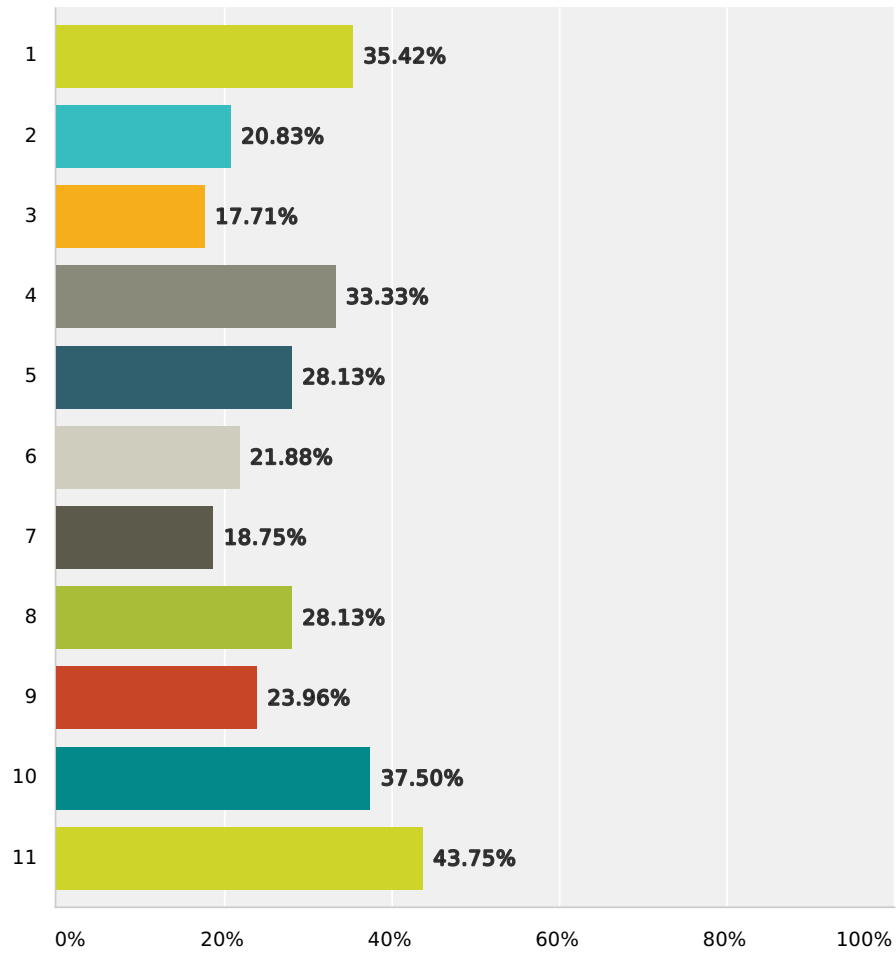

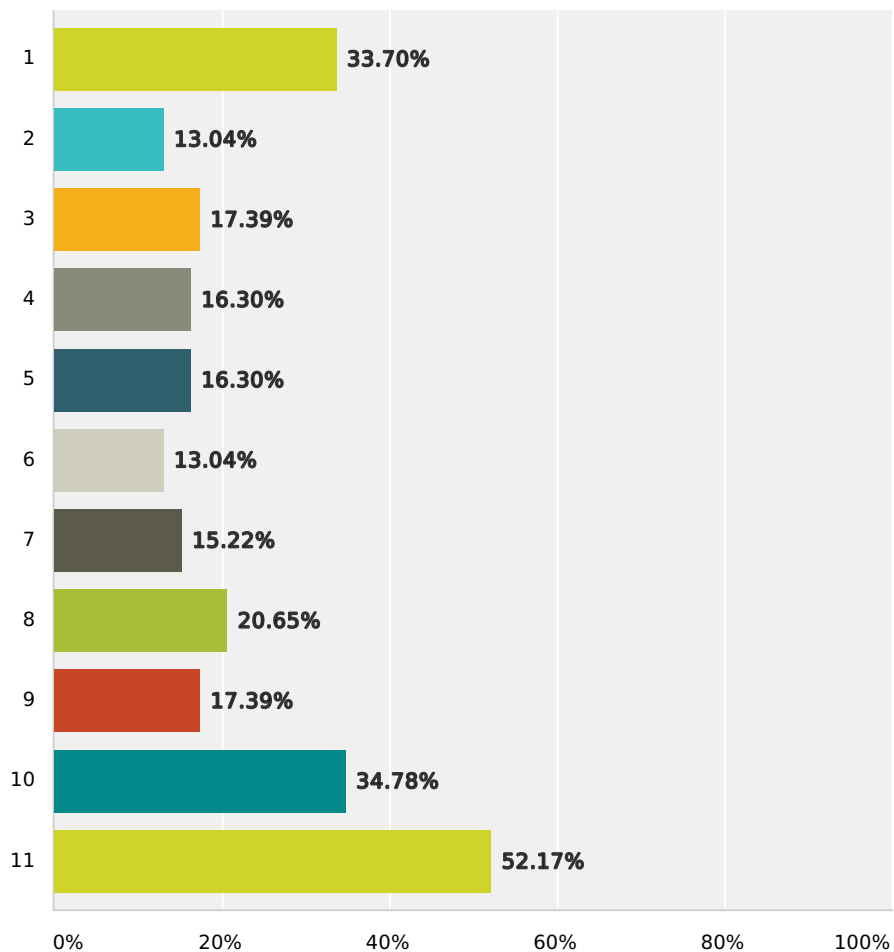

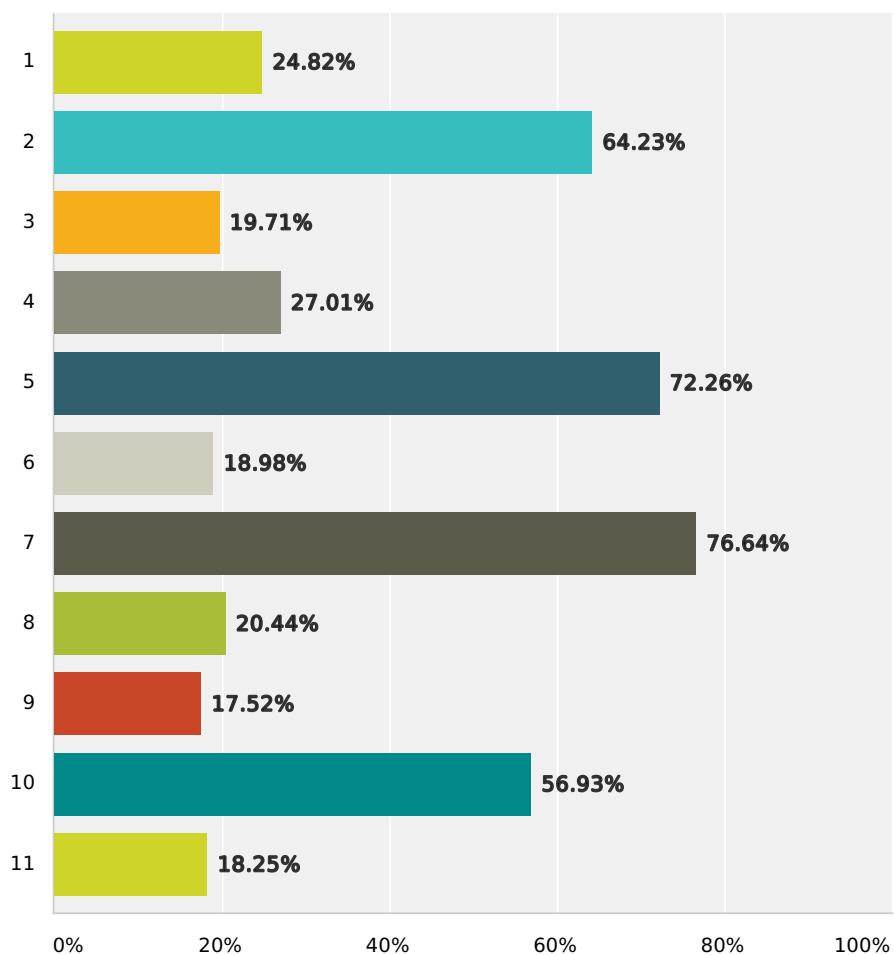

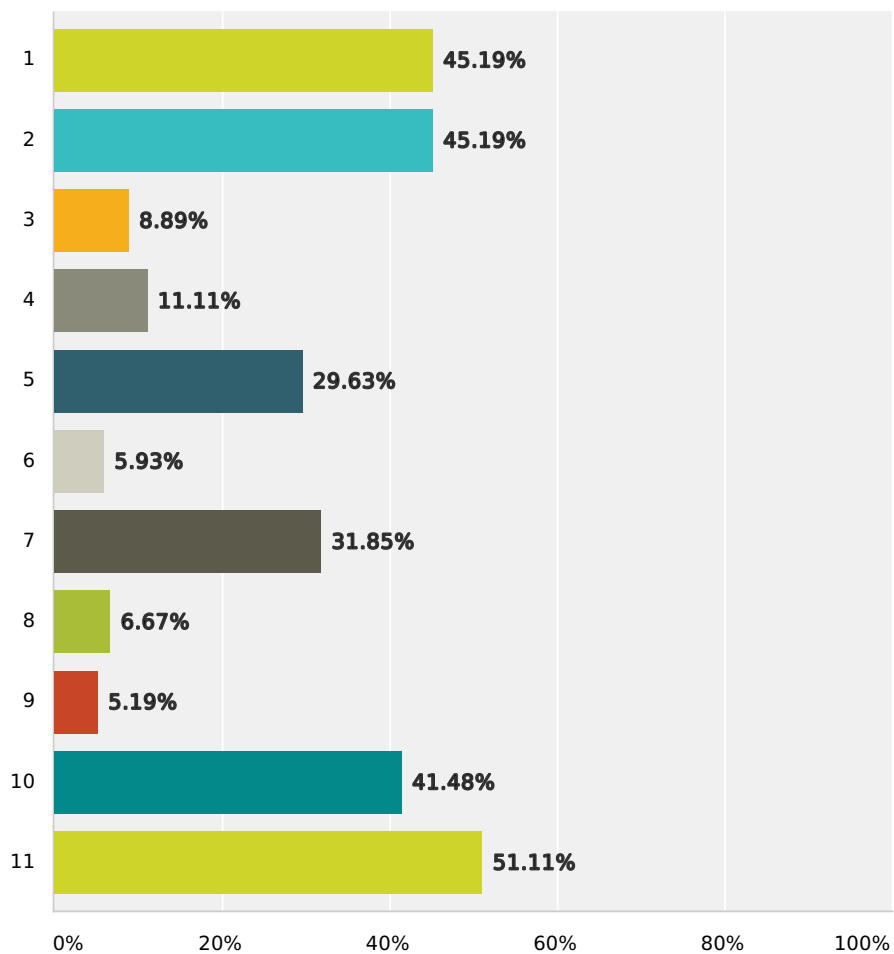

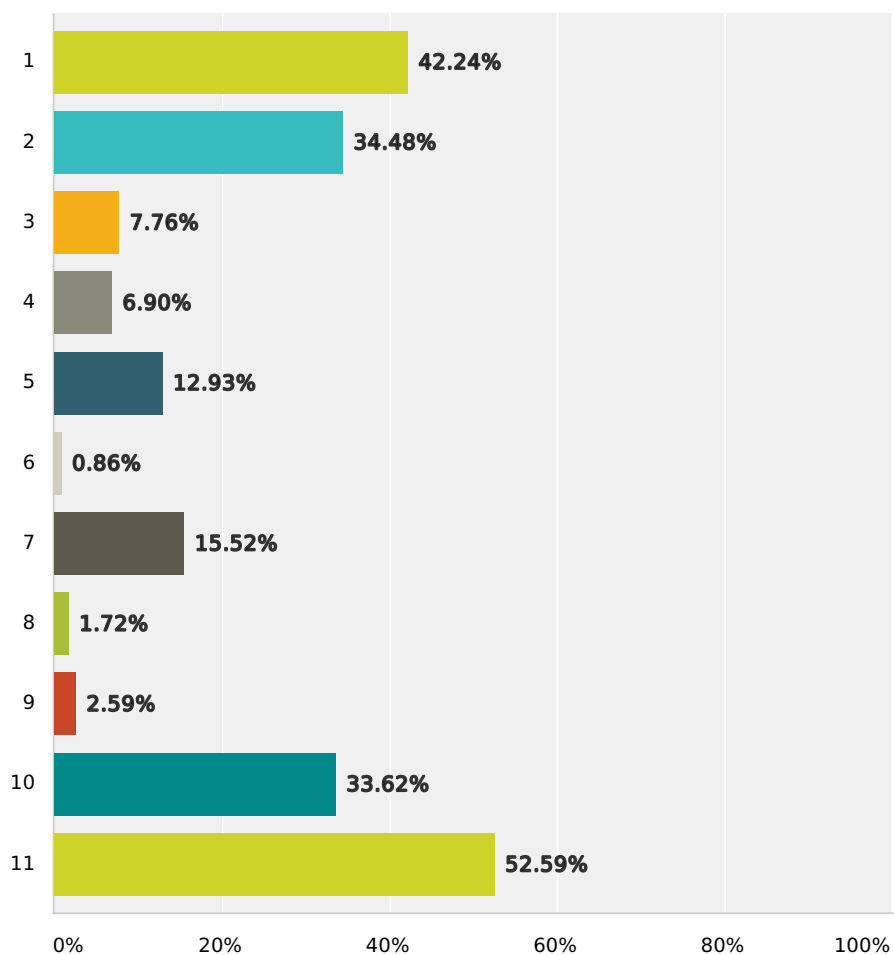

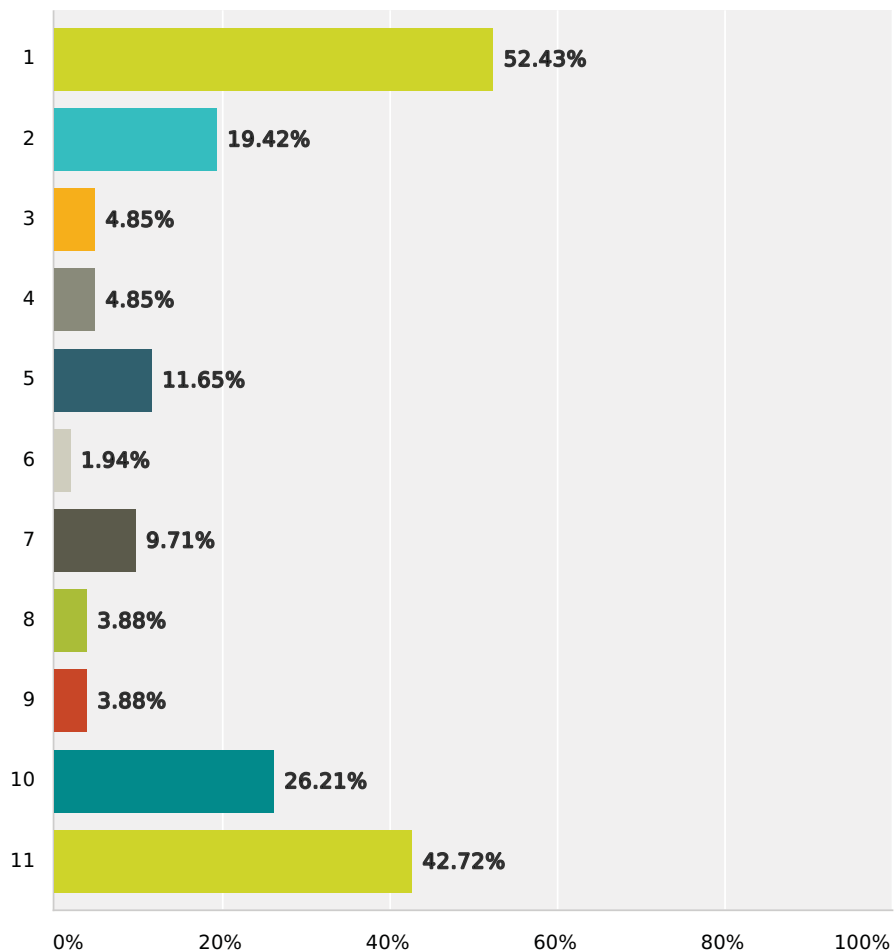

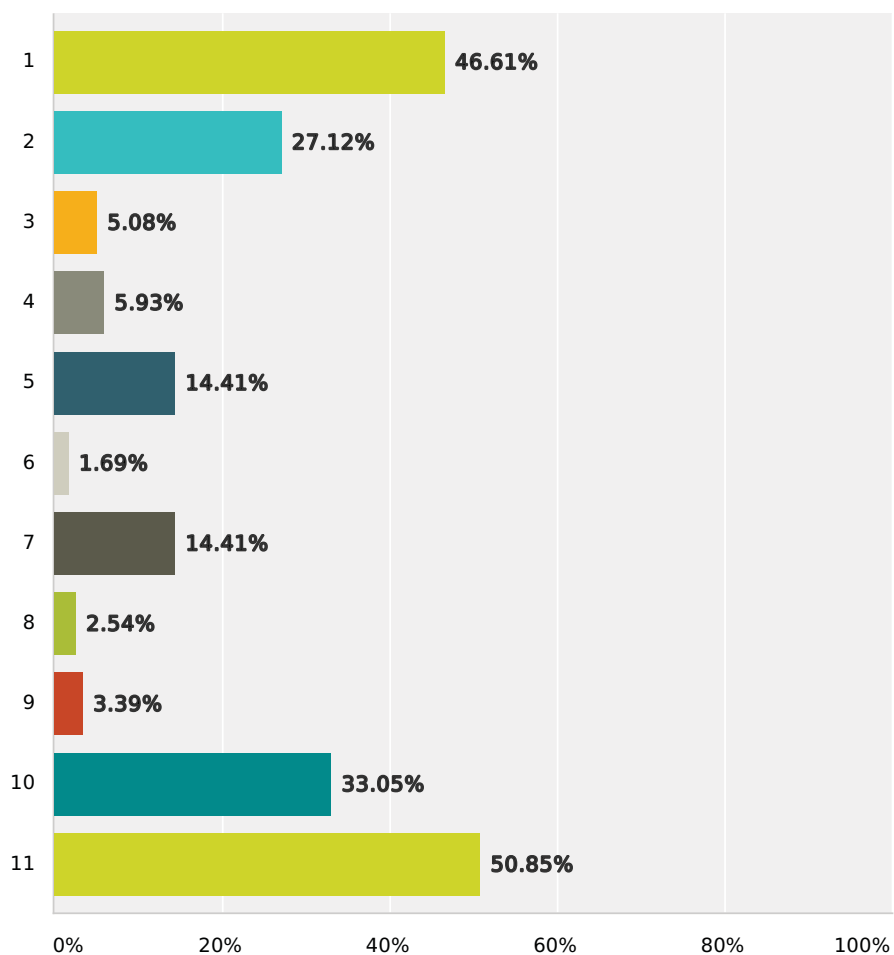

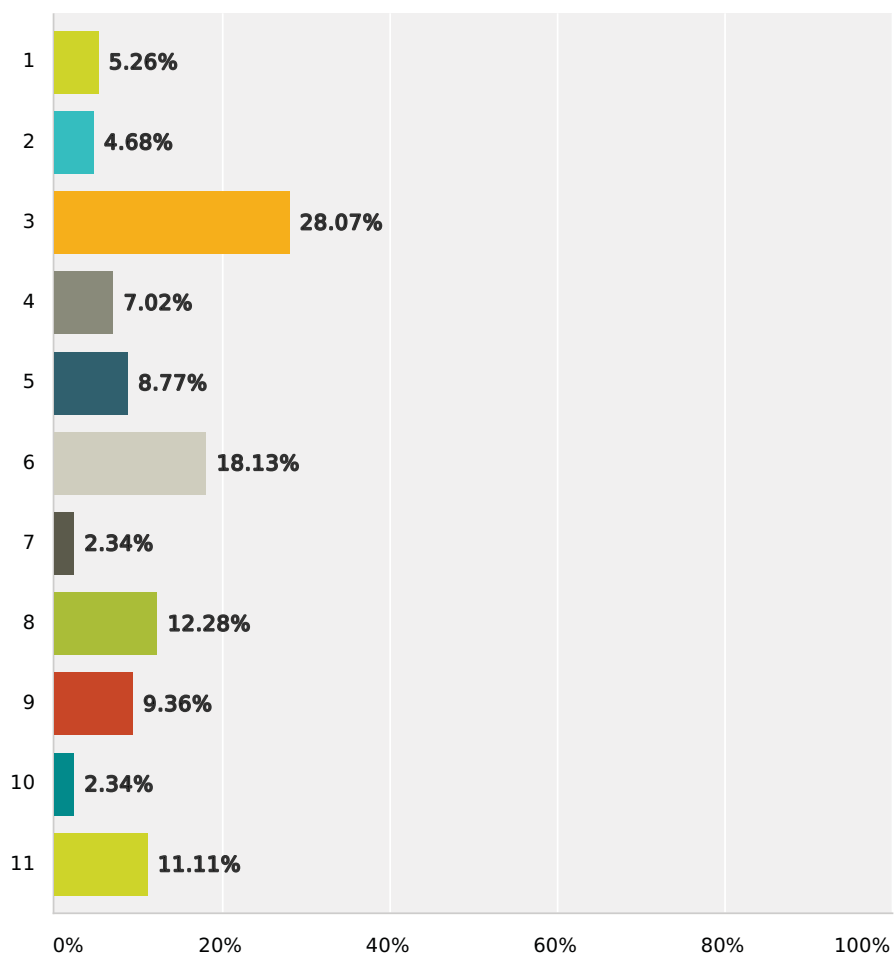
