Boston, MA – The Boston Trio returns to the ensemble's home town for the second time this spring after February's incredibly well received performances of Beethoven's Triple Concerto with the Boston Philharmonic Orchestra. One of today's most exciting chamber ensembles (heard by audiences around the United States, Canada and Europe), the Boston Trio is excited to revive its BT competition, a long-time tradition of the trio meant to give gifted young musicians a chance to perform with the world-class ensemble. This year's winner is violist Jesse Morrison, a second-year graduate student at the New England Conservatory, studying with Kim Kashkashian. This performance precedes a week of touring in Pennsylvania, where they're being presented by the Allentown Symphony, Pennsylvania State College, and the Gettysburg Community Concert Association.

ABOUT THE TRIO:

"Whenever this trio plays, drop everything and go hear them!" hailed the Boston Globe on the occasion of The Boston Trio's Tanglewood debut at Ozawa Hall. Since their formation in 1997, the trio has quickly become one of today's most exciting chamber ensembles. Acclaimed for their "rich and rewarding, absolutely balanced"

sound (Virginia Gazette), these virtuosic and profound musicians are committed to creating exceptional and daring performances of standard and contemporary repertoire.

Recent highlights for the Boston Trio include performances at UCLA, Detroit Pro Musica, University of Arkansas, Maui Classical Music Festival, Rockport Chamber Music Festival, Cape Cod Chamber Music Festival, Neskowin Chamber Music, Four Seasons Arts in Oakland, CA, Virtuosi Concerts in Winnipeg, and a debut of Thomas Oboe Lee's Piano Trio No. 3, which was written for the trio. The Boston Trio has been invited to perform on numerous prestigious music series including the Bank of America Celebrity Series. Next year, they'll return to the distinguished Sanibel Music Festival.

The ensemble was in residence at the New England Conservatory Preparatory School from 2005 to 2015. The Trio is committed to bringing chamber music to a broader audience through outreach activities at colleges, public schools and assisted living centers. The individual members serve or have served on the faculties of the New England Conservatory, the Boston Conservatory, Harvard University, the University of Maryland, and the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, and are in demand as master class teachers throughout the United States, Asia and Europe.
