The Covenants Footsteps Tour is a journey to the land of Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, and Jesus or *Yeshua*. Here the Promised Savior taught the Way, the Truth, and the Life. Here, the Final Redemption occurs. This is one-bus tour with limited seating, that uncovers hidden sites and ancient paths. The tour offers a life-changing experience of worship, new insight, new friendships, and a full color book of all tour teachings.

We visit the Knesset and Independence Hall as ambassadors for the Messiah. We volunteer in Samaria as a bridge of restoration to the Jewish people. We explore biblical sites where rocks cry out.

On the shoulders of Jerusalem, we see the same panoramas of Benjamin's and Judah's land that kings and prophets saw. We follow the Tribes of Israel to Mount Gerizim, to declare God's blessings. At the Spring of Harod, we worship where God reduced Gideon's Army to a chosen few. In Zippori, we walk the village that Joseph and Jesus (*Yeshua*) may have helped build. At Safed, we view the Galilee from Israel's highest mountain. In the Valley of Elah, we take our stand against Goliath, alongside David.

At the epicenter of God's Kingdom in Jerusalem, we visit the living waters: the pool stirred by an angel where *Yeshua* healed a lame man; Hezekiah's pool where the High Priest drew water for the Temple altar; and the newly uncovered Gihon Spring House where Solomon became king and future waters will gush to the Dead Sea.

We stop at the courtyard pavement of Antonia Fortress where

Roman soldiers crowned Yeshua with Atad branches, and played the Basalinda game. We follow His crucifixion through the Lion's Gate, and across the Kidron Valley. We rededicate ourselves under a chuppah in the Garden of Gethsemane, enter the Temple Mount, and sing at the Kotel on Kabbalat Shabbat.

We discover the Red Heifer sacrifice site on the Mount of Olives, and discuss Yeshua's sacrifice, resurrection, and return on the Mount of Resurrection. We stroll the Kidron Valley past the tombs of royalty, prophets, and priests.

We circle Jerusalem, the city that bears God's Name, to explore Bethel, Ramah of Samuel, Gibeah of Saul, Simeon's Tomb, Ramah of David, Rachel's Tomb, and Migdal Eder where angels informed shepherds of the Messiah Yeshua's birth.

Covenant Footsteps takes you from Jeroboam's altar at Dan, to the Cave of John the Baptist in Judea. Explore with us, and rekindle your love for the Bible.

Saturday, October 17 Depart for Israel

Travel to Israel.

Sunday, October 18 Tel Aviv

Check into Dan Panorama Hotel on the Mediterranean Sea.

Monday, October 19 Mediterranean Coast

Independence Hall

Site of Israel's Declaration of Independence.

Caesarea

Roman amphitheater, aqueduct, hippodrome, and palaces.



Atlit Internment Camp

British detention camp for Jews during World War II.

Overnight at the Leonardo Haifa on the Mediterranean Sea.

Tuesday, October 20 Galilee

Haifa

Overlook the city, Haifa Bay, and the geometric Bahai Gardens.

Mount Carmel

Stand where Elijah challenged the prophets of Baal.

Study the Jezreel Valley below, the site of Armageddon.

Zippori

Explore the mountain town that Joseph and Yeshua may have helped build. Here, the Sanhedrin convened, and the Mishnah was born. Worship at the Freedom and Redemption synagogue dedicated to the Lamb, and visit the villa with the famous Mona Lisa of the Galilee mosaic.

Nazareth Shuk

Local shuk market for lunch and the best buys in Israel.

Nazareth Village

Explore a first-century home, synagogue, olive press, and wine press in Yeshua's hometown. Check into the Golden Crown in Nazareth.



Wednesday, October 21 Galilee

Explore the Galilee, center of Yeshua's ministry and miracles.

Capernaum

Visit the ancient synagogue located where Yeshua preached. We will have teaching and quiet prayer beside the Sea of Galilee.

Bethsaida

Visit the capital city of the Geshur Kingdom from King David's time, and enjoy the lakeside where Yeshua multiplied loaves and fishes.

Korazim

Time permitting, explore the town that Yeshua cursed and see a native Atad tree, whose painful thorns the Roman's used to crown the Messiah.

Sea of Galilee

Embark on a voyage on the waters of the Sea of Galilee, to worship with Messianic recording artist Daniel Carmel.

Yardenit

Go to the Jordan River, with an opportunity for immersion (baptism).

Thursday, October 22 Northern Israel

Tel Dan

Trek to Jeroboam's altar in the forest for heartfelt repentance.

Safed

Visit old synagogues, a genizah with sacred scrolls, a bema, unique candle shop, and Israeli art shops. Sample the local “Yemenite pizza.”

Mount Arbel

View cliffside homes of the priests, and re-enact the Beatitudes.

Poriyya

Stroll through a Messianic Jewish gallery high above the Sea.



Friday, October 23 Galilee, Elah Valley, Jerusalem

Spring of Harod

Visit the waters where God reduced Gideon’s Army to a chosen few.

Beit She’an

Explore a spectacular city of Roman amphitheater, columns, baths, basilica, and a temple in a world-class heritage site.

Valley of Elah

Take our stand where David slew Goliath.

View the Philistine wheat fields, set ablaze by Samson.

Jerusalem

At Goldman Promenade, pray the traditional *shehechyanu* thanksgiving prayer from the place where Abraham and Isaac saw Mount Moriah.

Check into the Prima Kings Hotel for five nights.

Pray, sing, and dance at the Kotel for Kabbalat Shabbat.

Saturday, October 24 Jerusalem

Attend a Messianic Jewish Sabbath service.

Enjoy a Sabbath rest, and a special afternoon teaching.

Stroll Ben Yehuda Street at sunset, where hundreds gather after Shabbat for the festive atmosphere of street musicians and performers.

Sunday, October 25 Jerusalem's String of Pearls

Antonia Fortress

Visit the courtyard pavement where Roman soldiers crowned Yeshua with the thorny branches of the Atad tree, and played the Basalinda game.

Pool of Beit Zaida (Bethesda)

At the waters stirred by an angel, Yeshua healed the lame man. Nearby the Temple flocks were washed for sacrifice at Fuller's Pool.

Lion's Gate - Stephen's Gate

We walk through the gate toward Yeshua's crucifixion, and the stoning of Stephen just outside the Old City.

Garden of Gethsemane

Crossing the Kidron Valley to Gethsemane, we pray in a peaceful garden and re-dedicate ourselves under a chuppah.



Miphtakh

Visit the place where the priests burned the Red Heifer to ashes.

Mount of Olives

Panorama of Jerusalem from the top of the prophetic Mount of Olives.

Kidron Valley

Where Melchizedek and Abraham met, walk past the tombs of the Prophet Zechariah, Temple priests, Absalom, and James the brother of Yeshua.

Beit HaMa'ayan - House of the Gihon Spring

Newly open for visitors, this ancient fortress covers the mouth of Gihon Spring, the waters of future Bible prophecy. It was here that David's men penetrated Jebusite Jerusalem, and Solomon was crowned king.

City of David and Pool of Siloam

Examine the Fortress of Zion. Enjoy the Pool of Siloam where pilgrims immersed in a mikveh. Rest where Yeshua healed the blind man.

Old City and Golden Menorah

Explore the Old City, and the Third Temple's Golden Menorah.

Monday, October 26 Exploring the Shoulders of Jerusalem

Bethel

Visit the site of Jacob's Ladder.

Ramah of Samuel

On Jerusalem's northern shoulder, scan the Great City and the Lands of Benjamin and Judah. Walk to Samuel's tomb, and the mikveh of Hannah.

Gibeah of Saul

In Saul's hometown, discover where the Roman General Titus camped to watch Jerusalem prior to his siege, and King Hussein began a palace.

Simeon's Tomb

Gravesite of Simeon who prophesied over baby Yeshua at the Temple. Nearby is the Valley of Rephaim where David defied the Philistines.

Kibbutz Rachel

On Jerusalem's southern shoulder, discover 3,000 years of palaces, the Ramah of David, and a villa built by the Roman Tenth Legion.

Elijah's Hill

Enjoy a stunning view of Bethlehem and Herodion at the site where Elijah stopped during his flight from Queen Jezebel.

Tzel Tzach - Katisima

Where Rachel delivered Benjamin and Mary rested before birthing Yeshua.

Migdal Eder

Watchtower of the Flocks, where shepherds watched over the Temple flocks, and received the heavenly angels announcing Yeshua's birth.

Cave of John the Baptist

At Kibbutz Tzuba see a superb view of Jerusalem, the recently excavated Cave of John the Baptist, and Second Temple winepresses.

Tuesday, October 27 Shiloh, Mt. Gerizim, Itamar

Shiloh

Explore Shiloh and the Tabernacle site.

Mount Gerizim

Declare God's blessings, with the Tribes of Israel, on Mount Gerizim.



Itamar

Volunteer work in Itamar, on the mountains of Ephraim.
Optional evening trip to Israel Museum.

Wednesday, October 28 Judean Wilderness

Masada

Explore Herod's mountain fortress above the Dead Sea.

Ein Gedi

Hike the waterfalls where David and his men hid from Saul.
Discover the Ein Gedi synagogue with
a secret warning in its mosaic floor.

Dead Sea

Plunge into the healing Dead Sea waters.
Optional evening trip to the Bible Lands Museum.



Thursday, October 29 Jerusalem

Temple Mount

Tour the Temple Mount and Eastern Gate, and pray at the Western Wall.

Second Temple Jerusalem

Walk the Ophel's Roman road, where money changers did business.
Descend into a stone mikveh. Ascend the steps where Yeshua entered the
Temple, and join our grand declaration of the Psalms of Ascent.

Knesset and Abu Ghosh

Experience the Israeli government chambers at the Knesset.
Enjoy a farewell dinner in Abu Ghosh, site of Emmaus.

PRICES: \$3,995.00 per person, based on double occupancy per room. Tips are included.

RESERVATIONS: Register as soon as possible, as seats are limited to ONE BUS. A per person deposit of \$300 (non-refundable) is required to guarantee your reservation. The deposit is applied to the total due if not cancelled.

FINAL PAYMENT: Final payment is due on August 1, 2015. Full payment is required with registrations made after August 1, 2015.

HOTELS: Deluxe and first-class hotels are provided throughout Israel. Prices are based on a per person rate sharing a twin-bedded room. A single room supplement will be charged by Israeli hotels.

MEALS: Meals included are buffet breakfasts and dinners. Beverages other than coffee or hot tea are not included.

TAXES: All service charges and taxes are included. International airport departure tax is included.

TIPS: Tips for luggage handlers, bellboys, hotel staff, tour guides, and bus driver are included.

AIR TRANSPORTATION: Round-trip airfare to Israel, from JFK in New York City, is included.

GROUND TRANSPORTATION: All ground transportation will be in an air-conditioned motor coach designed for sight-seeing.
