This year, the Student Event will be a launch party and book signing for the third edition of the CRC Handbook of Marine Mammal Medicine. IAAAM has made arrangements with the publishing company to offer the book at a discounted rate of \$110 for students. Any non-student attendees are welcome to purchase the book for the standard retail price of \$175. Pre-orders will be taken during your conference registration process, and a limited number of copies will be available for sale at the conference. ## **About the Book:**

For three decades, this book has been acknowledged as the most respected scientific reference specifically devoted to marine mammal medicine and health. Written by approximately 100 contributors who are recognized globally as leaders in their respective fields, the CRC Handbook of Marine Mammal Medicine, Third **Edition** continues to serve as the essential guide for all practitioners involved with marine mammals including veterinarians, technicians, biological researchers, students, managers, keepers, curators, and trainers. The 45 chapters provide essential information for the practitioner on pathology, infectious diseases, medical treatment, anesthesia, surgery, husbandry, health assessment, speciesspecific medicine, medically pertinent anatomy and physiology, and global health concerns such as strandings, oil spills, and entanglements of marine mammals. The book guides the reader through the veterinary care of cetaceans, pinnipeds, manatees, sea otters, and polar bears. In addition to summaries of current knowledge, chapters provide information on those digital resources and websites which present the latest information as it emerges in the field. The CRC Handbook of Marine Mammal Medicine, Third Edition gives a call to action for scientists to experiment with new endeavors to engage and inspire current and future generations to care for marine mammals and the marine environment, and work together to find solutions. #### **President-Elect**

Kathleen Colegrove, DVM, PhD, Dip ACVP: Dr. Katie Colegrove obtained her DVM from Virginia-Maryland Regional College of Veterinary Medicine in 2002 and went on to complete a residency in Anatomic Pathology at UC Davis. She became a diplomate of the American College of Veterinary Pathologists in 2005. Katie received her PhD in Comparative Pathology in 2008 from UC Davis and is currently a Clinical Associate Professor at the Zoological Pathology Program, College of Veterinary Medicine, University of Illinois where she has worked for the past 9 years. She is a consulting or contract pathologist for a number of marine mammal focused facilities, stranding organizations, and federal and state agencies. She has been a member of IAAAM since 2003, served on the Student Liaison Committee since 2007 and the Medway Endowment Committee since 2010, and was the Chair of the Student Liaison Committee from 2010-2014. She has been the IAAAM executive board member for education since 2014. Katie enjoys her job as an aquatic-focused veterinary pathologist as it enables her to collaborate with many IAAAM members.

NOTE: Dr. Colegrove is the current Board Member for Education and will resign that position if elected as President-Elect.

### Treasurer

**Tonya Clauss** received her DVM and MS from the University of Florida. She is currently the Senior Director of Animal Health at Georgia Aquarium where she has worked for the last 13 years. Prior to the Georgia Aquarium, Tonya worked as a Staff Veterinarian at Mote Marine Laboratory & Aquarium and as the Director of Veterinary Services at Pelican Man's Bird Sanctuary in Sarasota, Florida. She was also previously a Research Affiliate with The Florida Aquarium in Tampa. Tonya has served on the IAAAM Student Liaison committee since 2004.

**Dr. Allison D. Tuttle** is the Vice President of Biological Programs at Mystic Aquarium where she serves on the Aquarium's Leadership Team and oversees the Aquarium's veterinary, animal husbandry, and animal rescue operations. Dr. Tuttle has been an IAAAM member since 2002 and is the current Chair of the IAAAM Student Liaison Committee. Dr. Tuttle is currently serving within AAZV as Chair of the Scientific Program Committee and an Associate Editor for the Journal of Zoo and Wildlife Medicine. Within AZA, Dr. Tuttle sits on the Aquarium Affairs Committee, Honors and Awards Committee, Animal Health Committee, and is an AZA accreditation inspector. In 2016, Dr. Tuttle completed the AZA's Executive Leadership Development Program.

Dr. Tuttle earned her BS in Biology and Psychology from Washington College and her DVM from North Carolina State University. She completed Mystic Aquarium's Internship in Aquatic Animal Medicine and Research and also completed a Residency in Zoological Medicine with a focus on Aquatic Health Management at North Carolina State University. Dr. Tuttle is a Diplomate of the American College of Zoological Medicine.
