Join us for a fascinating look at the intersection of art and science in the world of entomology. Dr. David Yeates, Director of the Australian National Insect Collection, CSIRO, Canberra, will present a talk on the vibrant partnership between artists and scientists. Some of the very first human drawings depicted insects and for centuries artists have explored ways to communicate the intricacies, colours, forms and behaviour of insects through art.

David will also lead a short [drawing workshop on insects](#) focusing on structural elements such as insect eyes, legs, antennae and wing structures. He will provide artists with tips for good illustration, using both live and preserved insect reference specimens.

What to bring: Pencils, ink drawing pens and paper suitable for sketching insects, plus a hand magnifying glass suitable for looking at small insects.
