



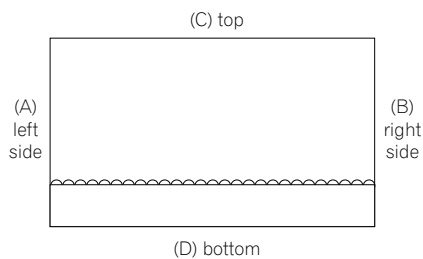

soft & simple sheet APRON

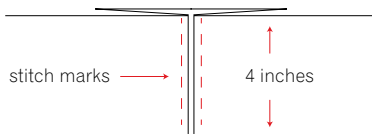
SUPPLIES

- 1 vintage sheet with a decorative edge any size
- scissors
- ruler
- sewing machine
- pins
- thread spool in coordinating color
i use white because i prefer to see the stitches
- iron
- 3 decorative buttons
- needle and thread

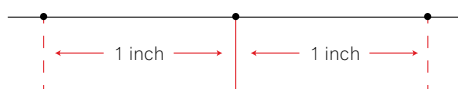

INSTRUCTIONS

step 1 – cut a 31 inch x 18 inch rectangle from a sheet with the sheet's decorative edge along the bottom width of the rectangle (D). see visual 1

step 2 – to finish the sides of the apron, (A) and (B), press a 3/8 inch hem once and then again. machine stitch along the edge of the hem on each side. the double fold will give stability to the sides of the apron and hide any raw edges

step 3 – cut out visual 3 and center along (C). transfer the dots to the fabric. start with the far left dot and fold in to the center dot. press fold flat. repeat the process with the far right dot and bring it in to the center dot. see visual 2

step 4 – stitch from the top edge down 4 inches, on each fold to form your pleat. see visual 2

step 5 – to make your side pleats, repeat steps 3 & 4 by positioning visual 3, 4 inches in on the left and 4 inches in on the right.

step 6 – for the apron tie, cut a strip of your sheet 5 inches wide x 7 feet long. press the strip in half lengthwise to 2.5 inches wide. fold in the two long edges .375 inch as well as the short ends of the apron tie and press.

step 7 – find the center of apron tie and insert (C) of your apron body into the apron tie, matching up center points. pin in place and machine stitch all four sides of apron tie as close to edge as possible.

step 8 – hand sew decorative buttons at the bottom of your three - 4 inch pleats. congratulations, you are now finished with your soft & simple sheet APRON!
