## Twisted Pine to Play at UU Wellesley Sept. 27

On Sunday, Sept. 27, the Unitarian Universalist Society of Wellesley Hills, 309 Washington St., will present Boston's bluegrass band "Twisted Pine" as part of the first Visitors' Day celebration of the church year. The award-winning band will be an electrifying addition to the day's festivities.

"We are delighted to welcome the community to this special event," said Membership Committee Chairperson David Barnard, "and we are thrilled to have this amazing band with us. It's going to be a

real treat."

The line-up for the Sept. 27 Visitors' Day will start with a church service at 10:30, led by the Senior Minister Rev. Sara Ascher. The theme of her sermon will be "The Faith Virus." Following the service, all are welcome to gather in the courtyard for barbecue and music. The event is free and open to the public.
