2016-2017 Year-in-Review & Council Accomplishments

Below we outline some accomplishments in the past year that indicate how we are working to fulfill our mission.

Promote – To promote service learning in the state, the CSLC has facilitated **networking** between local service learning partners, practitioners and facilitators.

- CSLC hosted 2 networking events with 9-10 attendees from different organizations per event
- CSLC members were involved with organizations doing related work:
 - ◊ CCMW's Engaged Faculty Institute and Continuums of Service Conference
 - ◊ Civic Health Network P-20 Action Committee
 - ◊ Daniels Fund grant for Civic Education

Advance – To advance service-learning in the state and beyond, the council has supported/facilitated **research** informing the field around how service learning impacts practice.

- Initiated a CSLC AmeriCorps VISTA Summer Associates Program (in partnership with CCMW), 42 Members served with 19 sites, 12,600 hours of service
- Developed service-learning online training modules
- Conducted Service-Learning Workshop in Durango
- Conducted PeaceJam Service-Learning Workshop
- Furthered partnership between Regis & 21st Century Schools program

Institutionalize – To institutionalize service-learning, the CSLC has **advocated** for service learning through presentations, workshops and meaningful partnerships. Examples of such events include:

- Secured fiscal sponsorship with Campus Compact
