



Entry Level Scientist Position – Advance Notice

The US Army Corps of Engineers New England District anticipates posting openings for entry level interdisciplinary scientists for eligible recent graduates as part of the Pathways “Recent Graduates” Program. Please monitor USA Jobs for the announcement (<https://www.usajobs.gov/>).

This is an opportunity to join the world’s preeminent public engineering organization supporting our nation’s civil works and military missions, including the regulation of work in waters and wetlands of the United States. Work: In addition to delivering vital engineering and construction services that span the full breadth of the Corps’ civil and military missions, the US Army Corps of Engineers New England District regulates waters of the United States through the Clean Water Act, the Rivers and Harbors Act, and the Marine Protection, Research and Sanctuaries Act. Work is performed in an interdisciplinary team environment, working with scientists and engineers.

Successful applicants will perform a two-year internship during which time they will be placed in rotating developmental assignments working and learning in Regulatory, Planning, Engineering, Project Management, Operations and Construction offices within the District. This internship will expose individuals to the various capabilities of the Corps in New England.

Requirements: Successful applicants will have a sound foundation in ecological, biological, physical, and social science theories, practices, and methodologies, as they relate to the natural and human environment.

Eligibility: Applicants must have obtained a qualifying degree, or completed a qualifying career or technical education program, as determined by Office of Personnel Management, within the preceding 2 years. However, veterans may be appointed up to 6 years after obtaining a qualifying degree if military deployment kept them from applying previously. Applicants must be U.S. citizens.
