WHAT CAN I DO WITH MY WHEAT?

I have been getting calls about weeds in wheat fields. Once the flag leaf is emerged there is no herbicide labeled to use. For most of you that means you have no options right now, however you may want to consider a pre-harvest application of Roundup (Credit Extra) or 2,4-D. The labels state to apply after hard dough stage or at 30 % moisture or less and at least 7 days prior to harvest. For Credit Extra only 1 qt. can be applied.

If you are considering using a fungicide you still have several options once the head emerges. You cannot put any strobilicid containing products (Statego, Headline, Quadris, Quilt) on headed wheat, but you still can apply Prosaro and Caramba at flowering (Feekes 10.5) for head scab control and other diseases. These fungicides have a 30 day harvest restriction and have no restrictions for feeding the straw. With the weather we have had lately I would recommend you apply a fungicide to prevent any yield loss. Call T H if you need additional information.

MESSENGER GOLD - TIMING

Potatoes

Fresh market growers will soon be making the first application of Messenger Gold. Potatoes with tuber initiation should receive 3 ounces of Messenger Gold with a second application 2-3 weeks later. A third application 2 weeks before vine killing should be made on storage potatoes.

Seed potato growers should make the first application of 3 ounces at the hooking stage, with a second application 2-3 weeks later.

Growers can expect increased yield, common scab suppression and better plant health in potatoes.

Messenger Gold will also benefit snap bean growers, sweet corn growers and other vegetables. Give us a call if you have any questions.

FUNGICIDE FORECAST

While most people are still spinning their wheels in the mud from this wet spring and late summer, the 2013 Farmer's Almanac predicts that the Midwest will have a growing season that is warmer than usual with a normal amount of precipitation. Whether or not you believe the Almanac or your instincts, the fact is that we have been wet for three weeks, with this wet weather brings disease.

On your corn acres an early application of fungicide at V-5 can help aid in disease control and keep corn plants greener longer. An option to use a preventative and curative fungicide would be an application of Stratego YLD at 2.5 oz/acre at V-5 or 5 oz/acre at corn tassel, the other option at V-5 is Headline AMP at 10oz per acre . Another route would be a newer chemistry from BASF called Priaxor that not only has strobilurin but a new curative called xenium which is applied at 4oz/acre.

If you were able to get the soybeans in the ground before the rains came, you might be worried about white mold. DuPont's Approach fungicide applied at 9oz/acre on R-1 to R-3 beans will not only control white mold but also soil-borne diseases. Keep in mind that Approach is a preventative fungicide only. Approach is in limited supply, so order today. Stratego YLD is also labeled on soybeans at 4 oz per acre when applied at early flowering. This application will control any blight, rust, or leaf spot problems occurring in your soybeans.

Christmas Trees



Wet and cold weather seems to describe the spring we have had. Many species of trees have broken bud and can no longer be sprayed with pre emergent herbicides. Weeds have also come on like gangbusters and are growing rapidly. What can we do now?

Growers have a number of options. Grasses can be sprayed with Clethodim (Select, Arrow, etc). Application over any trees at any time will control emerged grasses. Grass should be 4-6 inches tall and actively growing. A rate of 8 ounces per acre along with crop oil at 1 pint per acre will give good control.

If broadleaf weeds are a problem you can spray Stinger at ½ to ½ pint per acre. The weeds should be less than 5 inches tall. If you want you can mix the Stinger with a grass herbicide, but skip the crop oil. Give me a call if you have any questions.

BALSAM TWIG APHID

Growers should monitor fields for Balsam Twig aphid. Look for mucus liquid forming on the new growth, especially in areas of the field where you saw it last year.

Options are available to control this pest. One option is Lorsban 4E (chlorpyrifos) at 1 quart per acre. Please give me call with any questions.
