God May See It Differently

I know I have told some of you this story, perhaps more than once, but it is a good one and bears repeating. The names and some of the details have been changed to preserve privacy.

Back in the days when I was a hospital chaplain, each week I would go up to the psych unit and conduct an “Interfaith Service” in which we would pray, talk about our prayers, and discuss how it related to our lives. More than a few patients were there multiple times in my years there, and I give thanks I was able to get to know them and come to consider them my friends. Two of them in particular stand out over the years, Michael and Sean.

Michael suffered from delusions that were bizarre beyond anything even remotely believable, and Sean suffered from episodes in which he was completely unable to remain calm or stop talking for even a few seconds. One day when both of them were in the group, Michael was having particularly florid delusions, and Sean was even more agitated than usual. It was getting out of control, and I was wondering how I was going to hold the group together.

Suddenly, for no particular reason I have ever been able to discern, Michael stepped out of his psychosis and calmly and compassionately said, “Sean, you need to calm down.” Immediately, Sean calmed down and became as peaceful as I had ever seen him. A few seconds later, Michael returned to his delusions, though not so severely as to disrupt the group.

As far as I can remember, Michael and Sean were never together in the group again, and I don’t recall that Sean was re-hospitalized in my remaining years at the hospital. I saw Michael in the hospital several more times and once in the community, but he did not improve significantly.

The Holy Spirit was present in power that day. God called someone out of their distress and enabled them to help a neighbor in need.

We too suffer. There are times when we are unable to take care of our own problems, let alone reach out to our neighbor in need.

Michael and Sean taught me that God may see it differently.


Weather Cancellations

Council members met after the Annual Meeting to fill positions: Joanne Gardner, President; Wendy Becker, Vice president; Jeff Peterson, Secretary; Cindy Zuber, Treasurer; Members at large: Deb LeHerissier, Kim Freeman, Marilyn Kroneburger, Kyle Fohlin, Lelita McKetty, Paul Olson, Jack Zuber. A council retreat will be held during February to consider, prayerfully, what Immanuel's path will be as we, like so many other mainline churches locally, have a large building to maintain and decreasing resources. Additionally, we will seek Holy Spirit guidance to explore once again what is "our mission."

In a broad stroke the long-term options before us include "doing church differently" and changing how we maintain a church family/worship here on Hanover Street, consolidating with another church to share costs, or continuing on as we are but expecting that eventually endowments will be needed to pay bills. Some council members believe that if former members were invited to return, things might return to the way it used to be-vibrant and multi-aged. All persons are asked and encouraged to call on former attendees to visit once again. They have been missed! Attendance on Sunday mornings is typically averages in the 40s-50s. One council member has suggested a monthly "town hall meeting" during fellowship time to seek members' feedback and hear council updates. The Synod has asked that all congregations update their constitutions; this is one task that will be initiated this year.

Council meeting nights have changed! We will meet on **SECOND** Thursdays at 6:30pm.

Thank you for the farm "Good Gifts" donations! Checks totaling \$125 were mailed from the church to the ELCA, which was in addition to private mailings. God bless our animal and farm gifts.
