IPC OVERVIEW

This class offers a brief review of the history of plumbing and the changes that have brought about the current codes we use today. Many of the chapters in the International Plumbing Code will be presented and explained including: Chapter 1 Administration of the Code, Chapter 3 General Regulations, Chapter 4 Fixtures, Faucets and Fixture Fittings, Chapter 5 Water Heaters, Chapter 6 Water Supply and Distribution, Chapter 7 Sanitary Drainage, Chapter 8 Indirect Waste, Chapter 9 Venting, and Chapter 10 Traps, Interceptors and Separators. The training will include how to size drainage and vent piping, and identify many code violations that are often overlooked by contractors and inspectors.

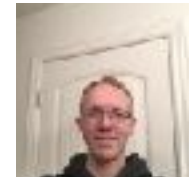
