Dear Colleagues,

In this first week of Lent, in 2018 there has been sustained criticism of the Catholic Church. The focus on the Church's temporal assets, quantified globally in today's market, suggests total figures which are staggering. What has been missed in much of the commentary is the purpose and nature of these "assets", which are largely made up of land and buildings owned by various groups within the Church. As we are acutely aware in our schools, these assets exist in order for people in the Church to exercise valuable works in health, welfare, education, and worship. Much of the land was originally donated, or in effect "collectively purchased" by members of the faithful over many years and with future generations of Catholic families very much in mind. In Australia, many of the buildings have been constructed by volunteer labour and with generous financial donations. This "intergenerational" mindset of Catholics has fostered the physical development of many Catholic institutions in Australia over the past 200 years.

There are countless stories within the rich histories of many of our Marist schools, which illustrate a firm, patient and tenacious commitment to a vision for a school that in some cases took more than a lifetime or two to be realised. Boarders sleeping on open verandahs, multiple classes in Parish halls, demountable classrooms, which in time became "mounted" with rust and vegetation, are just some of the common lived realities. In his brilliant book, "Worth the struggle", Brother John Luttrell fms tells the history of the growth of numerous Catholic schools from their humble beginnings. Consistent in this narrative is the generosity, foresight, and vision of Australian Catholic men and women since 1820. At the core of their sacrifice was a commitment to foster God's loving presence in the world. The vast majority of Church "assets" are enablers of that same commitment and have helped define the manner in which Catholics throughout the world have sought to answer Jesus' call to prayerful, God directed action.

In the midst of the criticism, the clarity of Pope Francis' Lenten message is encouraging. Pope Francis, urges us to experience Lent as a time of grace, inviting us "*to come back to the Lord wholeheartedly and in every aspect of our life.*" As followers of Jesus, the Pope reminds us that we are preparing for the "Fire of Easter".

*Above all, I urge the members of the Church to take up the Lenten journey with enthusiasm, sustained by almsgiving, fasting and prayer. If, at times, the flame of charity seems to die in our own hearts, know that this is never the case in the heart of God! He constantly gives us a chance to begin loving anew.*

May this Lent be a time when we Marists collectively throughout our schools and ministries, echo the words of Saint Marcellin, "see how they love one another".

## From the Regional Director ...

As a newcomer to MSA I have a great opportunity to view the goodness of Marist Education and while I have only visited some of the schools I am so impressed with how well the characteristic of Marist pedagogy are imbedded in the practices of schools.

Some of highlights are:

- There was a strong family spirit and great hospitality at Sacred Heart College Adelaide on 24 January when over 300 staff came together to start the year. They started with Principal, Steve Byrne challenging staff to model relationships and to remember that it is not what we say but what we do that will have the greatest impact on students and this was followed by the MLF team introducing the 2018 theme of 'An Audacious Hope'. This is an appropriate theme for SHC as 2018 marks the next stage of the amalgamation of Marymount and SHC.
- At the first assembly at Marcellin College on 8 February held to celebrate the achievements of the Year 12 students from 2017 classes we were reminded by staff and those being celebrated that this achievement was due to hard work and dedication. The boys winning awards also acknowledged the staff who accompanied them in a genuine and practical way were essential to their success.
- Travelling to Catholic College Sale and Lavalla Catholic College I quickly noticed the spirit of teamwork among staff. It was obvious at a Leadership team meeting where leaders were engaged in problem solving to work out what is the best for all students so that they are all loved equally. It was also apparent in the staff room at Sale, where staff were gathered around the table planning with the buzz of conversation reflective of teamwork.
- Walking through the learning spaces at Marist College Bendigo and watching teachers and students engaged in learning there were clear signals that students were being accompanied in their learning and that the family spirit was very much alive. Later Darren McGregor had the College Council working together in a practical way as they had to put together a jigsaw events in St Marcellin's life and the early day (since 2013) of Marist College Bendigo challenging those present to reflect on the journey.

These are mere snapshots of my experience in the first month but it is already clear that the practices in MSA schools are a living expression of Marist pedagogy. I look forward to seeing more as I venture further afield.



## NEWMAN COLLEGE PERTH

On 8 February, our Newman College community gathered in celebration of the Eucharist at our PK-12 Family Mass. In gathering with over 3000 people, we celebrated publicly what it means to be an intentional community that is animated by the presence of the risen Jesus. In the Year of Youth, we highlighted the significance of such an event for our young persons and invited them to seek faith-filled opportunities, especially in light of the national Marist theme for the year centred around hope in our future (Jeremiah 29:11).

This annual event commenced our school year and also launched the Newman College Ministry Plan and our Vision for Learning Shine Through Discovery - let your light shine (Matthew 5:16). In his homily, the Most Reverend Timothy Costelloe, Archbishop of Perth, affirmed and encouraged our dual moral purpose as a Catholic and Marist educational community. This was the second occasion for this annual event and it was greatly supported by staff, students and families who have embraced the call to community and have entered into this space that we as a proud Catholic community have sought to create.



