Day 1

Mark 5:21-24
 How is Jairus different from many of the other synagogue leaders in the Gospels? What do you think made him different?

Day 2

Mark 5:24-28
 How does the woman's faith make you feel? Have you ever felt so sure of something as she did?

Day 3

Mark 5:29-34
 Jesus knew that his clothes had been touched, and the woman knew Jesus was talking about her. What do you think made her so scared to tell Jesus what she had done?

Day 4

Mark 5:35-36
 How is Jairus' faith like the woman's faith? How is his faith different?

Day 5

Mark 5:37-43
 The healing of the woman in the crowd was very public and many saw. Why do you think that Jesus was so secretive about healing the little girl, even to the point of telling those in the room not to speak of it?
