John 6:1-21 - Feeding the 5,000 and walking on water

Day 1

John 6:1-3
The crowd followed Jesus because of the signs and wonders. Why do you follow Jesus? What draws you to him?

Day 2

John 6:4-10
Philip and Andrew both react to the idea of Jesus and the disciples feeding the people. What do you notice about their responses? What do you wonder? What would you say to Jesus?

Day 3

John 6:11-14
Imagine for a moment the feeling of abundance for these people! When have you felt this kind of abundance in your life?

Day 4

John 6:15
What do you think frightens Jesus about being King? Is it personal? Does he fear the political fallout of the Jews choosing a king?

Day 5

John 6:16-21
These two stories about Jesus seem to bend the rules of time and space. Food from nearly nothing, walking on water, and suddenly arriving at a distant place. What are you most curious about in these stories?
