#### **INTERPRETATION SYSTEM**

On this Pentecost Sunday we will dedicate our recently acquired and implemented interpretation system, which enables us, with the aid of an interpreter, to have what is said in English during our worship services to be communicated into Karen and other languages nearly instantaneously. The system was made possible by gifts given in memory of Clayton Williams, son of Joe and Debbie Williams, who died last summer. In 2001, Clayton was among a group from Crescent Hill Baptist who traveled to Chiang Mai, Thailand. In subsequent years, others from Crescent Hill Baptist Church returned to Thailand for similar purposes. Those visits paved the way to Karen refugees uniting with our church when they began being resettled in Louisville in 2007.

**SAMUEL CLAYTON WILLIAMS SCHOLARSHIP**

Process:

Applicants will be asked to submit application by July 1.

Application will include:

Incoming Freshmen:

- Final high school transcript showing graduation in top 10% of class from JCPS high school
- Proof of acceptance into a school of higher education in Kentucky
- Member/regular attender of CHBC
- Essay on How "I keep it real". 200-400 words in length. Double spaced. 14 size font.
- Two character reference letters

Returning Students:

- Maintain 3.0 GPA and full time status, submit transcript
- Attend school of higher education in Kentucky
- Member/regular attender of CHBC
- Essay on "A life lesson I learned the hard way my first year of college." 400-500 words. Double spaced. Size 14 font.
- Two character reference letters (if reapplication, different letters than previously submitted)

Applications will be submitted to Andrea Woolley. Applicants' names will be removed and given a number for impartiality. A panel of CHBC church leaders will choose scholarship recipient by July 15.

Money awarded will be sent to the school to be used toward books, tuition, room & board. \$500 will be awarded for the fall semester. \$500 for the Spring semester. Students may receive the award more than one year; however, preference will be given to incoming freshmen. Only one scholarship will be awarded per academic year.
