### KAREN GROWN COFFEE FROM THAILAND FOR SALE

Steve Clark and Annette Ellard have a few dozen bags of coffee grown and roasted by Karen farmers in northern Thailand. The "Tobeebay" coffee 1 pound bags are \$14; 2 pound bags are \$25. You have a choice of three different roasts as well as whole beans or ground coffee. The coffee is not "certified" organic or fair trade' however, it is organically grown and fairly traded. Profits garnered by selling the coffee give Karen tribal people a source of income to support their families and help advocate for the well-being of ethnic minorities like the Karen in Thailand.
