A WORD ABOUT OUR AED

For several years we have had an AED (Automatic External Defibrillator) that was located in the closet in the church office. To make it more accessible in case it is ever needed, it is now located in a wall case outside the office and is armed with an alarm. If the case is opened an alarm will sound and the red lights will start blinking. You cannot turn off the alarm by closing the door you will need a special key to disarm the alarm.

You will also find within the red case, under the scissors, the pediatric pads. The use of an AED is self explanatory because it is voice activated and will tell you exactly what steps to take and when and what to do. Sarah despises slavery, even at that early age, and out of principle attempts to reject the gift. Kidd has given us a believable and elegantly rendered fictional first person account of Sarah's life.
