Each day during the month of Ramadan, when the sun goes down, Muslims conclude their daily fast with a special meal. This "breaking of the fast" is called iftar in Arabic. To observe iftar, Muslims often visit family and friends but they also try to attend their local mosque which serves a meal (futoor) as part of its nightly program. The program at the mosque often includes recitation from the holy Qu'ran, prayers (maghrib and 'ishaa) that are recited after sun-down, and the main meal. The program may also include a lecture or lessons in the rules of Islam, and sometimes additional prayers and supplications. Jason Crosby will be one of the speakers.

May's Reading Group selection is *The Woman Behind the New Deal: The Life of Frances Perkins, FDR'S Secretary of Labor and His Moral Conscience*, a new biography by Kirstin Downey. Frances Perkins is no longer a household name, yet she was one of the most influential women of the twentieth century. She was named Secretary of Labor by Franklin Roosevelt in 1933. As the first female cabinet secretary, she spearheaded the fight to improve the lives of America's working people while juggling her own complex family responsibilities. Perkins's ideas became the cornerstones of the most important social welfare and legislation in the nation's history, including unemployment compensation, child labor laws, and the forty-hour work week.
