May's Social Justice Movie is *Denial*, a 2016 British-American historical drama film directed by Mick Jackson which premiered at the 2016 Toronto Film Festival. When university professor Deborah E. Lipstadt includes World War II historian David Irving in a book about Holocaust deniers, Irving accuses her of libel and sparks a legal battle for historical truth. With the burden of proof placed on the accused, Lipstadt and her legal team fight to prove the essential truth that the Holocaust occurred. Based on the book *History on Trial: My Day in Court with a Holocaust Denier*.
