### FROM THE RABBI'S DESK

Dear Beth El Congregants and Friends,

Though still Summer, our year is under way.

Welcome to the 5776-5777 year! Our cycle of services for this year begins this month, and events pick up from there. Be sure to check out the calendar and mark all the activities, services, and social events that are on the horizon!

#### THINGS OF NOTE AND TO COME

The Elementary Biblical Hebrew course continues through July 24th. The follow-on course will begin in the Fall of 2016. Eight class sessions are planned for the Fall. These are tentatively scheduled on September 11, 28, 25, October 30, November 13, 20, December 4, and 11. For the moment, we are looking at 4-5:30 pm on Sundays at THOI, but there may be changes in the time. Contact Rabbi Joe to register. More details will be forthcoming when settled. For the Spring, we are considering a close study and translation course of prayers in the siddur, including meaning, as the text we will use for our study.

The Introduction to Hebrew course to learn the Alefbet and Vowels will take place this Fall. There will be a session on Sunday afternoons at THOI, on October 30th, November 13th and 20th, and December 4th and 11th. The same course will be offered on Wednesday evenings at 6 - 9 pm at Beth El in Harrisonburg on November 16th and 30th, and December 7th, 14th and 21st.

Death Cafés this year will be held Wednesday evenings, 7-9 pm on the following rotation: September 7th at Beth El, November 2nd at THOI, January 4th at Beth El, and March 1st at THOI.

Scheduled Rabbi-led Religious services for the current congregation year begin on Friday, August 19th, with the Bar Mitzvah of David Berger. See the official calendar for the full list of services and events.

The Shorty youth group and the Daled Class of the Religious school will be visiting the Richmond Holocaust Museum on August 21st. Please contact Rabbi Joe to reserve your ticket.

#### **TORAH**

The Torah Parashiot for the coming weeks (through September 3rd) are Balak, Pinchas, Matot-Masei, Devarim (Shabbat Chazon), Va'etchanan (Shabbat Nachamu), Ekev, and Re'eh. We are in year 3 of the triennial cycle (the third of the three divisions of the cycle of Torah readings).

#### **CALENDAR**

Rosh Chodesh for Tammuz was July 6th and 7th. Rosh Chodesh for Av is August 5th. Rosh Chodesh for Elul will be September 3rd and 4th. The evening of August 13<sup>th</sup> and the day of the 14th is Tisha Be'Av, the 9<sup>th</sup> of Av, the saddest day on the Jewish calendar, marking the destruction (twice) of the Temple in Jerusalem.

Rabbi-led services are scheduled: Friday and Saturday, August 19th and  $20^{th}$  (Bar Mitzvah of David Berger), and September  $2^{nd}$  and  $3^{rd}$  (Bar Mitzvah of Toby Rafferty).

Friday evening services are scheduled to begin at 7:30 pm, Saturday morning at 10 am, unless otherwise noted.
