
American Guild of Organists at St. John's

All members and friends of St. John's are invited to the Quimby Regional Competition for Young Organists to be held here on Monday, June 20, as part of an organ festival hosted by the Region VI American Guild of Organists and the city of Des Moines. The competitors will perform at 11:20 a.m., 1 p.m. and 1:50 p.m., and prizes will be announced at 3:15 p.m. The winner will give a recital Thurs., June 23, at 9:15 a.m. in our sanctuary.

St. John's is considered one of the cornerstone churches for the festival and will host several events. A dozen or more churches—and their pipe organs—will be featured as venues for workshops, recitals, concerts, demonstrations and organ crawls.

Four evening events are open to the public free of charge. They include an incredible hymn festival with Dr. Aaron David Miller, an organ recital by Jan Kraybill, a concert featuring the Brahms' Requiem, and the young international organ star Christopher Houlihan.

A Word from Our Pastors
 Pastor Rachel Thorson Mithelman

People were bringing little children to him in order that he might touch them; and the disciples spoke sternly to them. But when Jesus saw this, he was indignant and said to them, "Let the little children come to me; do not stop them; for it is to such as these that the kingdom of God belongs..." And he took them up in his arms, laid his hands on them, and blessed them. Mark 10:13-14, 16

My dear friends,

By the time you receive this edition of the Eagle Call our SE Iowa Synod Assembly will be over; however, because you raised your voice on behalf of children and youth, our synod will have (most likely) passed a resolution that calls us to partner with the ELCA and several of its associated ministries to address bullying, harassment, and other related violence too prevalent in our society. The resolution – *A Memorial Calling the Church to Speak and Act to Prevent Bullying, Harassment and Related Violence* – was brought to our March 2011 congregational council meeting by St. John's Rainbow Ministry Team. After discussion, it was then unanimously endorsed and forwarded to the SE Iowa Synod.

In the "whereas" section of the resolution, two ELCA Social Statements – on education and sexuality – are referenced regarding the need for children, in particular, to be safe from verbal/emotional/physical violence that might be inflicted upon them because of actual or perceived "differences." The "whereas" section ends with the words: *Whereas the voice of the church addressing the intersection of race, economic status, age, sexual orientation, gender identity, and physical ability is a powerful witness to the healing and life affirming Gospel promise*, the resolution then calls the SE IA Synod, the ELCA, outdoor ministries, campus ministries, Lutheran Social Services, and Lutherans Concerned/ North America to raise awareness of bullying and harassment, focus on prevention, seek to change bystanders into allies, and create partnerships between youth and adults.

I am very proud of your support – through your elected leadership - of this resolution, and I intend to speak in favor of its adoption on the assembly floor. As we have sought to strengthen the ministry of and to children and youth at St. John's in the past several years – an effort led so well by staff members Sheryl Reed and Megan Clausen – we have also become more aware of the challenges our children and youth face every day. Research cited in the resolution says that children with disabilities or special needs are at a higher risk of being bullied than others, and that *Bullying around issues of sexual orientation, non-conforming gender behaviors, and dress was the most common form of bullying, second only to issues of appearance (e.g. body size and disability)*. (1) **Therefore, our support of this resolution is a visible sign of our love and support for all children, and particularly for the children and youth of St. John's.**

I remember a conversation I had with a young mother a few years ago. An acquaintance of hers had asked if the young family would be leaving St. John's to join a suburban church now that they had a child. The mother said to me, "I had to laugh and then I said, 'You haven't been to St. John's lately, have you?'" Indeed, this community treasures each and every infant, toddler, older child, and teen who considers St. John's "home." And as Jesus did, we are called to take them up into our arms and bless them with our love. You have done that by raising your voice against bullying and violence.

Council Updates



After each church council meeting, I leave tired but excited about who we are, what we are doing and what we still want to do to "be in the city for good". We focus our meetings on the ministry of the church -- preaching the gospel and providing connections through meaningful relationships. Sure,

we need money for programming, supplies, to pay for utilities and maintenance but that is to help with our ministry.

I am pleased to report that our finances are on an even keel. Through April, we have brought in slightly more than we have needed to spend and that is a big step over the last few years. Your support is appreciated. There are some major expenses for tuck pointing and stain glass window repair, and with your gifts and the help of the St. John's Foundation, those repairs will be done in 2011. Please continue your regular giving as we enter the summer vacation season.

The main focus of our meetings has been on how to encourage year round stewardship. We want to encourage discipleship and that ALL we have is a gift from God. We regularly discuss the Ask, Thank, Tell stewardship book. The council is divided into three groups to bring those areas to life. The **Ask Group** has been working to get people to share themselves, including their time, talent and money. They want to encourage everyone to get involved in the community of St. John's by connecting with a group or activity. The **Thank Group** has been highlighting individuals and groups who share their time and talent in worship and activities. They want to make sure leadership is appreciated and to encourage everyone to support and reinforce our ministries. The **Tell Group** is working hard to share personal and collective stories about ministry at St. John's. They have highlighted events, ministry teams and individuals. All these activities will continue throughout the year.

We are also beginning to think about our a fall stewardship event. We are looking for a way to connect with everyone while sharing the gospel and the good news that brings to the ministry of St. John's. We already do much to serve the needs of our congregation and the

needs of the city, but there is still more we can do. I will share more about these plans in the next article.

I ask that you continue to support the council with your prayers and encouragement. Let us know what you think.

Prepare for Worship

Sunday, June 5 Seventh Sunday of Easter

In the days between Ascension and Pentecost, we gather with the disciples in the upper room, waiting for the Spirit to transform the church around the world. In today's gospel Jesus prays for his followers and for their mission in his name. Amid religious, social, and economic divisions, we seek the unity that Jesus had with his Father. Made one in baptism, we go forth to live our faith in the world, eager for the unity that God intends for the whole human family.

The readings are Acts 1:6-14; Psalm 68:1-10, 32-35; 1 Peter 4:12-14; 5:6-11; and John 17:1-11. The hymns will be ELW 389, "Christ is Alive! Let Christians Sing," ELW 654, "The Church's One Foundation," and ELW 826, "Thine the Amen." At 8:45 a.m. and 11 a.m. clarinetist Kris Joy will provide both offering and communion music.

Sunday, June 12 Day of Pentecost

This festival derives its name from the Jewish festival of Pentecost, observed 50 days after Passover. On the 50th day of Easter we celebrate the Holy Spirit as the power of God among us that heals, forgives, inspires, and unites. In the reading from Acts, images of wind and fire describe the Spirit poured out on disciples of all nations. In the one Spirit we are baptized into one body, and at the Lord's table the Spirit unites us for witness in the world.

The readings are Acts 2:1-21; Psalm 104:24-34, 35b; 1 Corinthians 12:3b-13; and John 20:19-23. The first reading from Acts, which describes the Spirit being poured out on the gathered assembly who then speak in various tongues, will be read simultaneously in a number of languages. If you speak a language other than English and would be willing to read some verses from Acts during the 8:45 a.m. or 11 a.m. services, please let one of the pastors or Larry Christensen know.

The hymns will be ELW 627, "O Day Full of Grace" (Danish), ELW 407, "O Living Breath of God" (Swedish tune with Spanish text), ELW 401, "Gracious Spirit, Heed Our Pleading" (Tanzanian) and ELW 400, "God of Tempest, God of Whirlwind" (Welsh tune with contemporary American text). At 8:45 a.m. Asphalt & Stained Glass will provide both offering and communion music. As a second Sunday of the month, there will be the rite of laying on of hands and

anointing with oil for healing at the communion rail at all services this weekend.

Sunday, June 19 The Holy Trinity

Though the word "trinity" is not found in the scriptures, this Sunday's second reading includes the apostolic greeting that begins the liturgy: "The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all." In the gospel Jesus sends his disciples forth to baptize in the name of the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit. More than a doctrine, the Trinity expresses the heart of our faith: We have experienced the God of creation made known in Jesus Christ and with us always through the Holy Spirit. We celebrate the mystery of the Holy Trinity in word and sacrament as we profess the creed and as we are sent into the world to bear witness to our faith.

The readings are Genesis 1:1-2:4a; Psalm 8; 2 Corinthians 13:11-13; and Matthew 28:16-20. The hymns will be ELW 413, "Holy, Holy, Holy, Lord God Almighty!" ELW 412, "Come, Join the Dance of Trinity," and ELW 414, "Holy God, We Praise Your Name." At 8:45 a.m. Katy McDowell will sing during communion.

Sunday, June 26 Time after Pentecost – Lectionary 13

The welcome of baptism is for all God's children. This baptismal gift sets us free from the power of sin and death. In today's gospel, Christ promises that the disciple who gives a cup of cold water to the little ones serves Christ himself. From worship we are sent on our baptismal mission: to serve the little ones of this world and to be a sign of God's merciful welcome.

The readings are Jeremiah 28:5-9; Psalm 89:1-4, 15-18; Romans 6:12-23; and Matthew 10:40-42. The hymns will be ELW 526, "God is Here!" ELW 641, "All Are Welcome," and ELW 546, "To Be Your Presence."

Wellness Ministry Update



Sandy LaBlanc, our new Wellness Ministry Coordinator was installed at the 8:45 a.m. and 11 a.m. services on Sunday May 15. After formally taking on this new non-stipendiary position we asked this long time member of St. John's to tell us about herself and her vision for Wellness Ministry here at St. John's.

Just a bit about myself: My husband and I have been members at St. John's for 29 years. I am an Associate in Ministry and have served the church at the national level for the last 27 years, the last 10 from the denominational headquarters in Chicago. My ministry has been focused on rural areas and small town which, by the way, has a lot in common with urban ministries. For the last 18 months, I've taken a sabbatical and listened for what God was calling me to do next. For the last year, I kept feeling

the call to St. John's to do servant ministry in the form of wellness of mind, body and spirit. Here I am! And I'm most happy to be here.

My office is in the McKinney Wellness Center. I will be working Tuesdays and Thursdays, well as Sunday mornings. I am not a nurse so the form of the ministry will be somewhat changing. Chaplaincy and Stephen Ministry are in my background, and I have a passion for prayer ministry.

The first item on the agenda is working with the Health Ministry Team on a survey to find out what you, the congregation, want in terms of wellness of mind, body and spirit. We'll analyze the results and go from there. What is envisioned, however, is to form teams with a point person; these teams will each have the same passion. The point persons will meet once a month.

I have begun asking people if they would like to join me in an intercessory prayer group. We will meet to pray for (among other items) the ministries of St. John's; the staff of St. John's; the outreach and evangelism efforts; the synod staff and their ministries; the denominational staff, and all the various ministries throughout the ELCA. Events occurring in the USA and the world will be prayed for as well.

Some years ago, I helped with a study on best practices in growing congregations. The very first thing listed was a vital prayer ministry. Just think about how often Jesus went away to pray! What better example could we have; but also, Jesus listened to what God was calling him to do. So we too need to listen, rather than just talk at God. My 21-month-old granddaughter, after her nightly prayers, will say "amine" - she can't pronounce "amen" as yet. How many of us think of "amine" - what I want - rather than "so be it," which is the meaning of "amen."



Last week I visited a person in hospice, and I always ask what they would like me to pray for. The response was a whole series of things they were thankful for. Now that is an example of wellness of mind, body and spirit! Let us move forward to create this at St. John's!

"This is the day the Lord has made, let us rejoice and give thanks in it!"



There's just no money. I've always paid my way...
