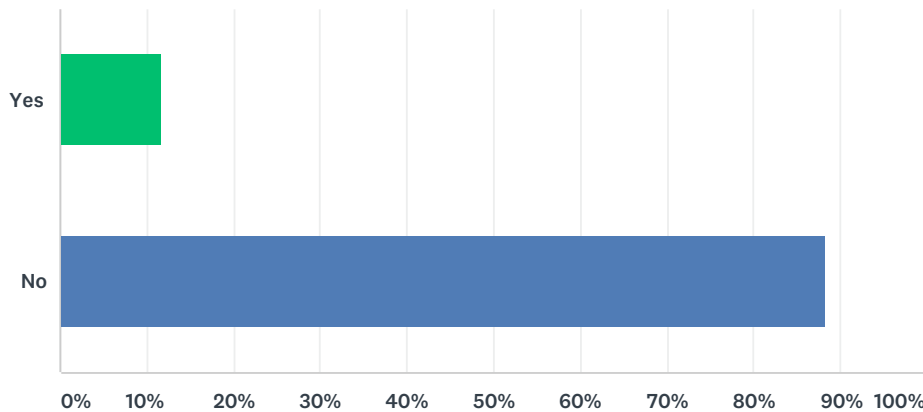

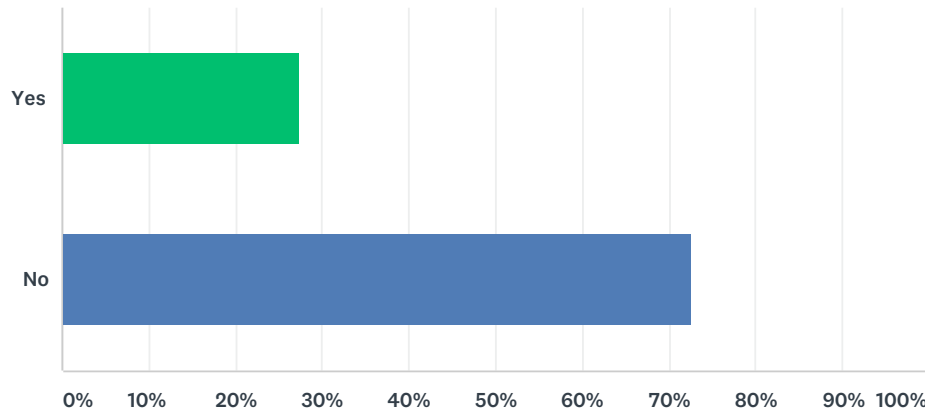

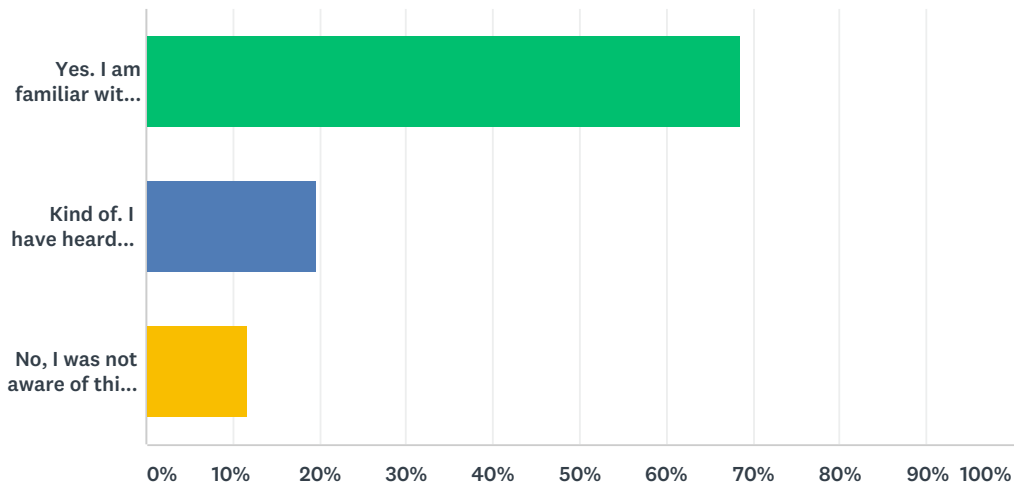

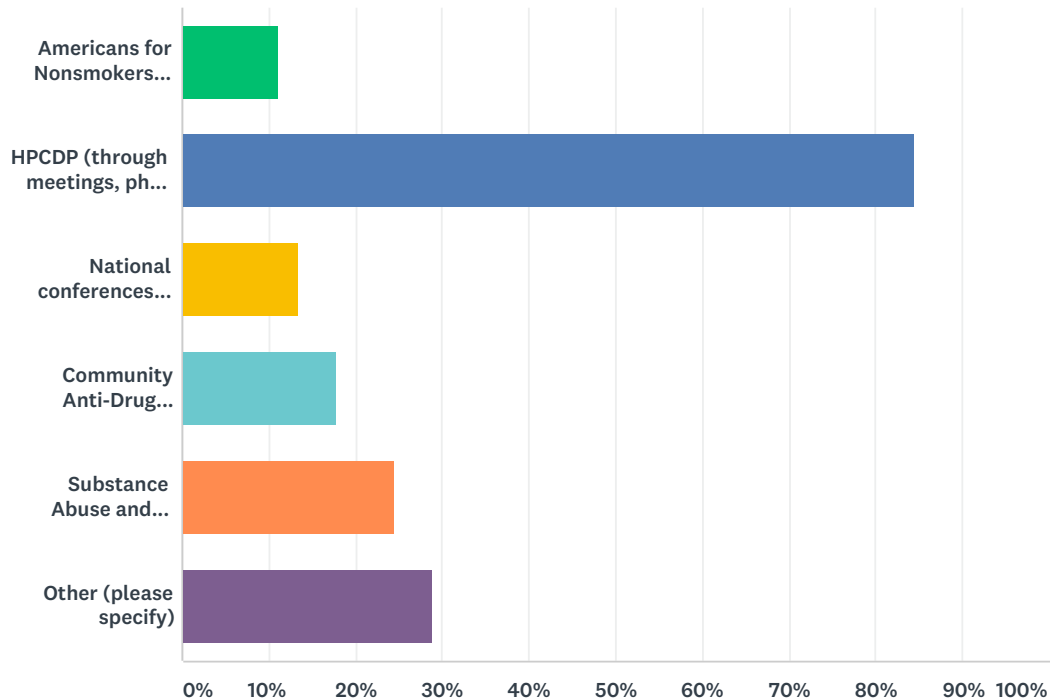

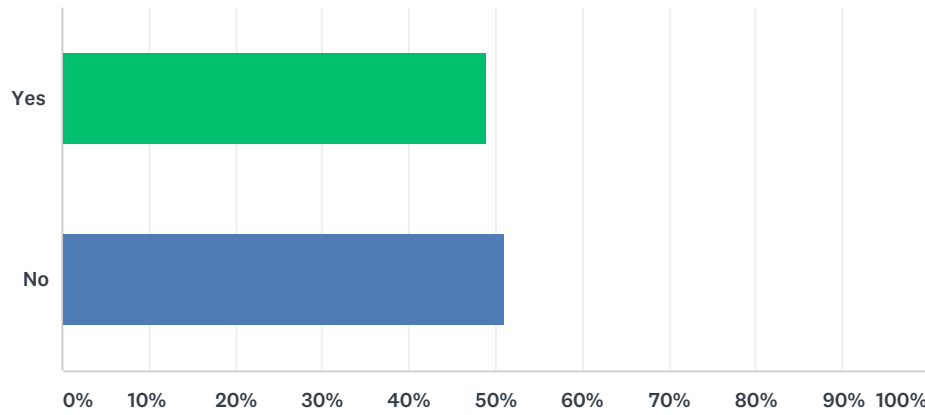

## Q7 Have you taken steps to educate others in your organization or community about smokefree laws and efforts to allow INDOOR public smoking/vaping of marijuana?

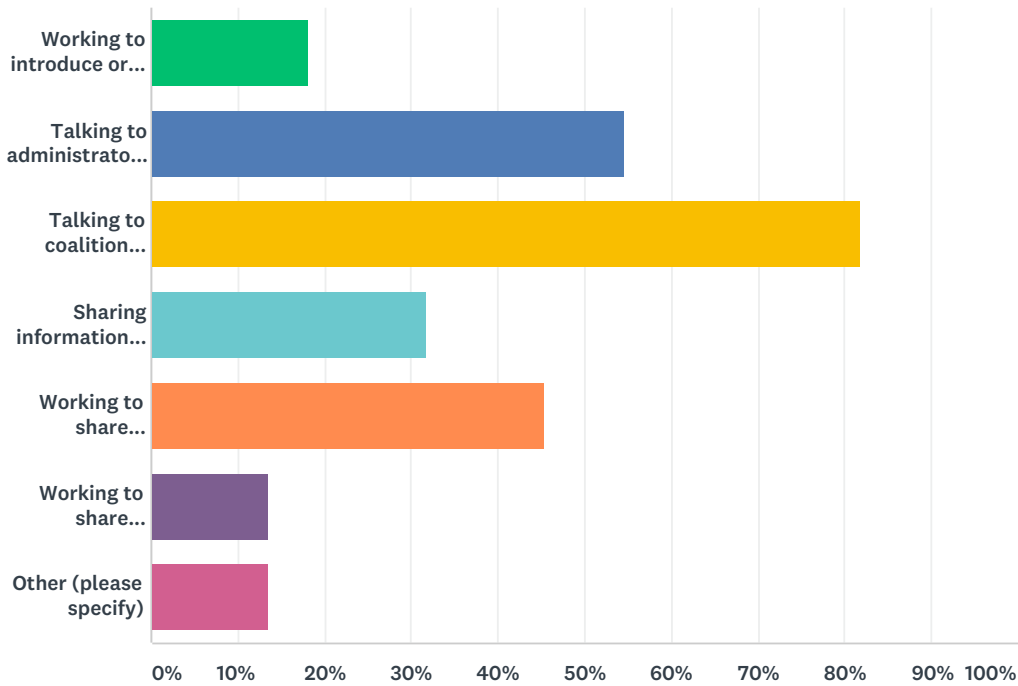

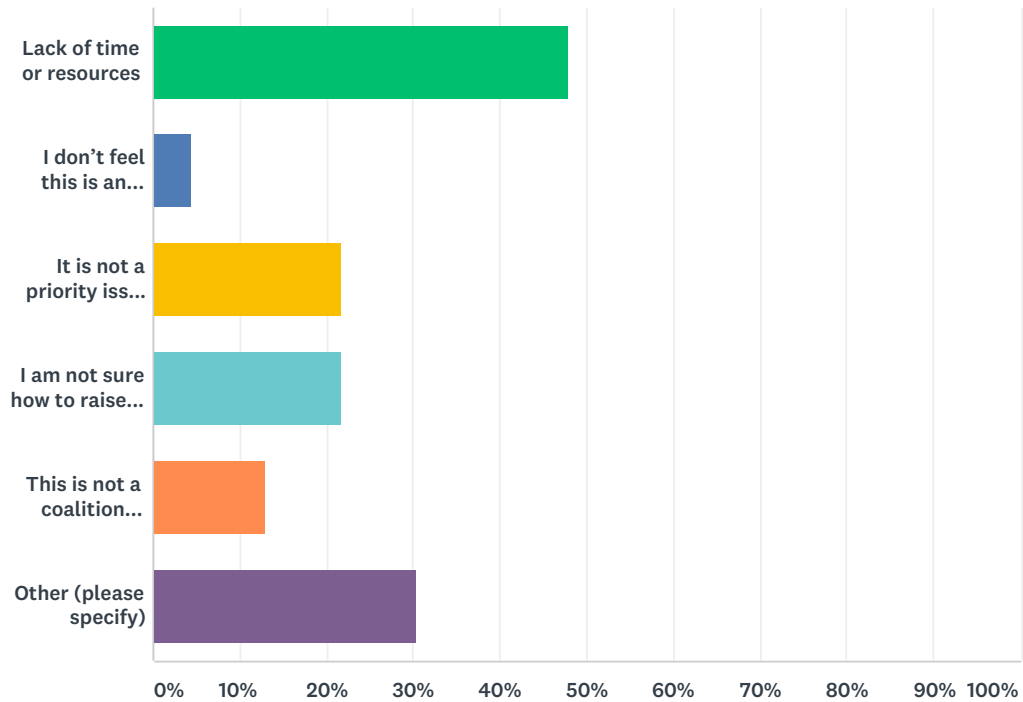

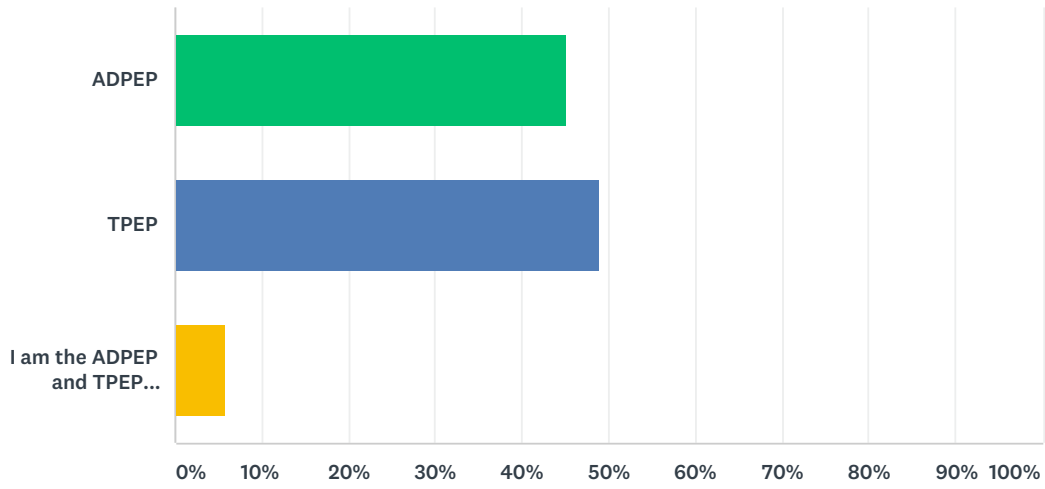

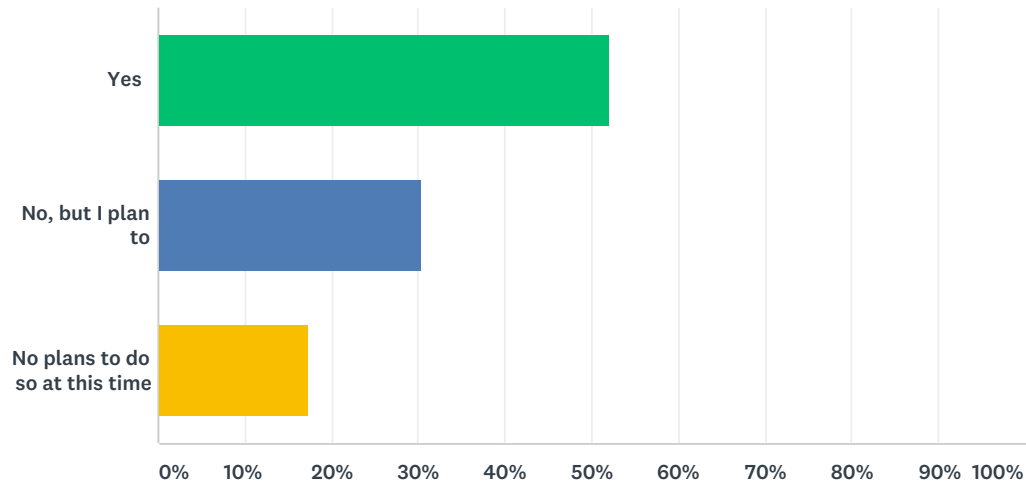

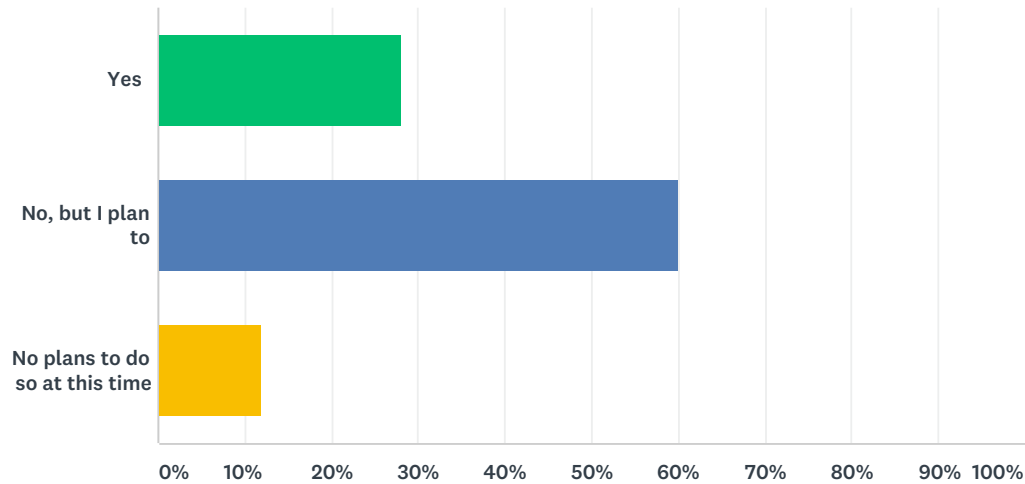

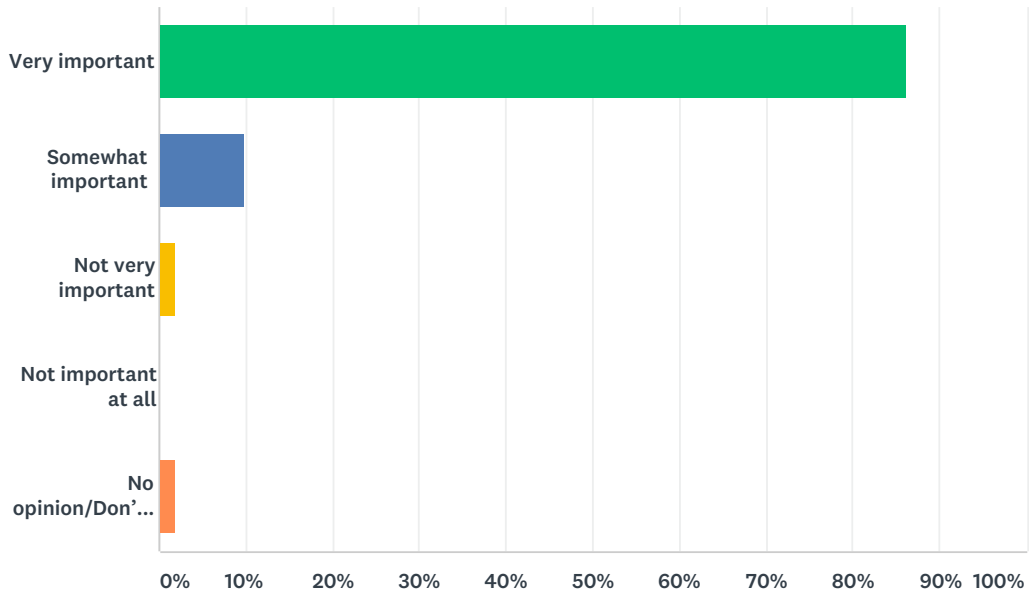

## Q15 Overall, how important of an issue do you feel prohibiting smoking/vaping marijuana in INDOOR public areas is?

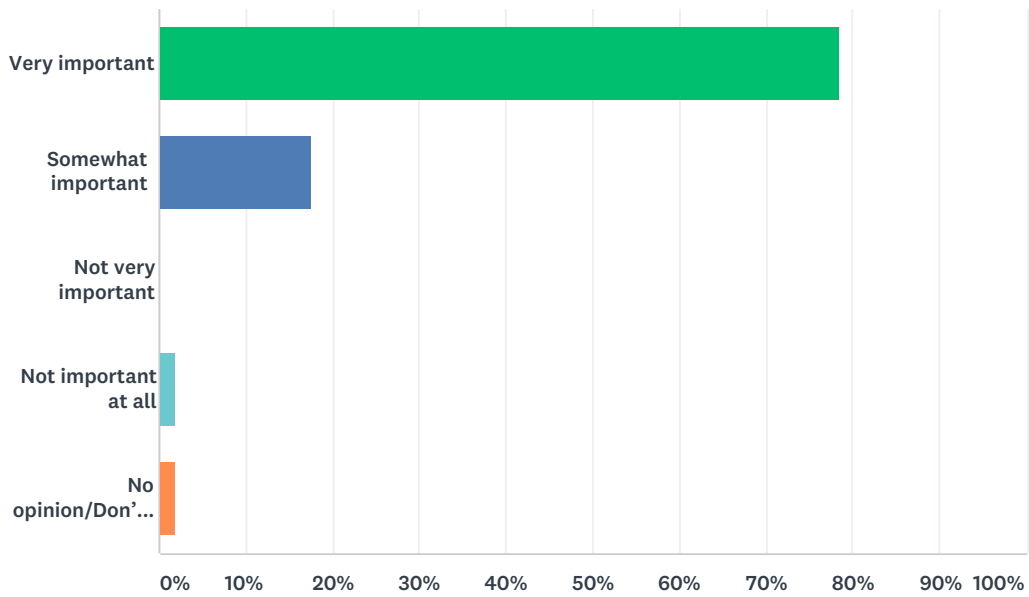
